Modern Times New Buffalo Township Public Library Re-Opens, Blending Cozy Atmosphere With State-of-the Art Services by Stefan Barkow

There are those who say libraries are obsolete...

...All the information you need, we're told, is available online.

During the grand opening Saturday, Aug. 16, of the new New Buffalo Township Public Library, visitors were reminded of how little people who make such observations know about what a modern library means to the community it serves.



In the bright light of late morning, I stood amid a large crowd before the glass doors of the new library. "Dewey," a colorful statue of a unicycling bibliophile on permanent loan from the Harbor Country Public Arts Initiative, greeted us from nearby. The crowd around me featured people of all sorts: the elderly and the young, entire families and good friends. A line of children stood at the very front, carefully watching everything. Shortly, we would be allowed inside the newly constructed library, and we would be the first members of the public to do so.


Library Director Julie Grynwich faced the crowd from behind a blue ribbon that, for now, prevented entry. Members of the local Veterans of Foreign Wars post raised the stars and stripes overhead as the crowd pledged itself to the flag and the liberty for which it stands. Like so much else in the library, the flag was a donation. It came from the architectural firm that designed the building: Fishbeck, Thompson, Carr & Huber Inc.

Standing with Grynwich were the staff, teen advisory board, interior designer Alice Riemschneider, representatives from Skillman construction management and library board members, as well as the Friends of the Library.

Grynwich introduced Sandra Sporleder, the board's vice president, who offered her thanks and appreciation for all those involved, from the initial \$900,000 grant from the Pokagon Fund, to the many private donations that followed, to the Skillman Corp. for handling every obstacle and completing the project "both on time and under budget."

Standing outside, the entire staff seemed ebullient, ready to show the community everything the new facility had to offer.

Their excitement is understandable.

"We never even had a parking lot before!," Sporleder said.

room fitted with speakers and a podium for larger community programs and meetings. A small kitchenette area is attached from which staff were providing cookies and lemonade that day, while Emmie Lo sang and played the guitar for guests.

A Skillman representative presented Grynwich with the key to the library mounted on a commemorative plaque. Then, over-sized scissors in hand, Sporleder cut the ribbon as the crowd applauded.

We swept into the building, people quickly swirling off into their own eddies to explore and discover. "It's just like a beach house," remarked one awestruck patron.

He is absolutely right.

Every corner of the facility feels open and airy. With large windows and high ceilings, every room is flooded with natural light. The carpet, bookshelves and furnishings are in soothing modern colors that evoke the beachfront greens, blues and grays along-side pale wood finishes.

To the immediate left as you enter the building is the Pokagon Room: a large, divisible conference The main floor holds most of the collection, with tables for patrons grouped through the middle and along the walls. To the west, a door leads outside to a spacious pergola-covered patio with plenty of seating — perfect for warm summer afternoons. When winter comes, patrons can move back inside and read from comfortable chairs clustered around a double-sided fireplace. On the eastern side of the building, there's a room complete with a wall-mounted monitor available where small groups can meet. Beside this is the local history room, with maps and more about the area and its stories.

Downstairs is the kids area, and with the assistance of the Teen Advisory Board — 30 or so involved teens who Grynwich says were "instrumental in almost every aspect" of the downstairs planning — it is everything a child could want out of a library. The



day, five girls were doing paper crafts there.

Through the middle of the room, among the many kidsized bookshelves, are plenty of study tables, couches and computers loaded with ageappropriate programs. On the eastern side, a sailboat's prow points into the room, offering space for kids to stow away with their favorite book. There's also a recessed space with rocking chairs and a lighthouse bookshelf, where a number of parents were already quietly read-

downstairs has many nooks, allowing children to become engrossed in their pursuits without distraction. At the same time, the centrally located services desk lets the staff easily keep an eye over everyone. Tucked in one corner is a glass-enclosed game room where friends can play video games together without disturbing others. In the corner behind this is a sun-lit booth where friends can sit together. That

ing to their sons and daughters. Sprinkled throughout the room on walls and pillars are puzzles that challenge children to count, match shapes and categorize fruits and vegetables. There's also a large walled-off craft room for messier or more raucous activities. Nine kids were doing bead craft when I was present.

At 18,000 square feet, the new library is $2\ 1/2$ times as big.

Grynwich said discussion to rebuild first began about 10 years ago. She credits Bonnie Kliss, her predecessor, with accomplishing much of the legwork that made it all possible.

"And," Grynwich continued, "it takes the right people at the right time. You need the right board and the right community for all of this to come together."

Come together it has, and in spectacular fashion, too.

The involvement of the community and the passion of those involved are evident in the many details of the building. The grand opening was only a taste of what the New Buffalo Township Public Library has in store for its patrons, with all kinds of new programs planned now that the space and resources are available.

This is a modern library in the truest sense of the word, from its design to its purpose. It is the very heart of the community it serves.

The previous library, built on the same site in 1978, couldn't offer the same luxuries.

With only 7,300 square feet, "We didn't have any room for programming," Grynwich said. "We had to turn people away all the time."




Scout Honors His Family During Eagle Ceremony

There are many levels in the Boy Scouts of America, but Eagle is the highest one can achieve.

Of those who enter the Boy Scouts, only 2 percent earn the Eagle rank, usually at age 17. A Scout wishing to achieve this designation must fulfill requirements in the fields of leadership, service and outdoor skills, all before his 18th birthday.

Considering the work involved, it's even more impressive that Troop 802 honored yet another of its members, Joseph Gondeck, with the Eagle rank on Aug. 17. A ceremony was held at International Friendship Gardens, where Gondeck completed his required service project.



"It really has been a family effort," Gondeck, said, "because I really couldn't have done any of it without the love and encouragement from my entire family."

Through the Scouts, Gondeck, 16, who attends Michigan City High School, has earned 44 merit badges, including the 21 necessary to become an Eagle Scout. For his service project, Gondeck chose to restore the area surrounding the Father Marquette Spring at International Friendship Gardens. It had become a bit rundown, and Gondeck wanted to fix it so everyone could enjoy the magnificence.

"Everyone around me was extremely supportive when I said that I wanted to take on the Father Marquette Spring as my service project, which I am very thankful for," Gondeck said. "One day, I got to thinking about a family trip we took to Hawaii, and there I saw how they would do so much to preserve their native heritage. It could have been something as insignificant looking as a rock, but they would make sure it was respected and taken care of.

"Father Marquette has been a very big part of this area's history. It's clear just by all of the different monuments and schools named for him, and I felt that the spring devoted to him should be treated in the same way – respected and taken care of."

Gondeck landscaped and repaired the natural spring. The project included clearing the path leading to the natural spring of brush and debris. The stairs leading down to the spring from Marquette

Trail were repaired and four steps replaced. A railing was installed for safety and ease while ascending and descending the stairs. A bench was added as a quiet place of meditation.

At the Aug. 17 ceremony, the Scouts present many badges to recognize those who have significantly influenced them in their journey, including parents and mentors. Gondeck chose to honor Michael Disbrow with a "Mentor Badge," and honored his parents, Kim and Paul, and sister, Maggie, with special badges. He also honored his grandmother, Barb Krueger, with a special angel pin for al-

ways being his guardian angel.

"I am eternally grateful for all of their help," Gondeck said, "as well as everyone else who has helped me on my journey. It is such an honor to become an Eagle Scout, and I couldn't imagine getting here without their help. Everyone has been so wonderful. I owe a lot to them."

Even though he's earned Scouting's highest rank, Gondeck plans to remain in Scouting for the fun and adventure he's associated with it. Now that he has gained the rank of Eagle Scout, however, school will move up on his list of priorities as he thinks about life after high school. Gondeck wishes to advance his schooling and become an environmentalist, keeping true to his desire to help the local environment. When he has finished with college, he wishes to return to the area, work for the Department of Natural Resources and continue to help the natural environments in the place he calls home.

"There are so many things I've learned from the Scouts," Gondeck said. "There is just one piece of advice I want to leave with the future generations: set goals, don't be afraid to ask for help and do a good turn daily."

Michigan City Public Library, 100 E. Fourth St., has announced the fall Writing Out Loud lineup.

Now in its 30th season, the series features writers of fiction and non-fiction, including local writer David Hoppe who, as a library employee in 1984, wrote the grant that created Writing Out Loud.

The schedule is:

• Hoppe at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 13.



Hoppe's writing explores politics and culture. He's been a writer, editor and columnist for the Indianapolis alternative paper, NUVO, since 1998, serving at different times as associate editor and arts editor.

He has received nine awards from the Indiana Society of Profession-

al Journalists. His book, "Personal Indianapolis" (Hawthorne Publishing), is a collection of NUVO columns written since 2001. He also wrote "Food For Thought: An Indiana Harvest (Indiana Humanities)" on the burgeoning food scene in the state.

Hoppe's essays and short fiction have appeared in a variety of publications, including Notre Dame Review, Utne Reader, New Art Examiner, Traces, Library Journal, Bennington Review and Arts Indiana. He received a Creative Renewal Fellowship from the Arts Council of Indianapolis with support of the Lilly Endowment.

Schmich was born in Savannah, Ga., and spent her childhood there. She attended high school in Phoenix, then earned a bachelor of arts degree at Pomona College in Claremont, Calif.

She has worked as a reporter at the Peninsula Times Tribune in Palo Alto, Calif., at the Orlando Sentinel and, since 1985, at the Chicago Tribune. She spent five years as a Tribune national correspondent based in Atlanta. PNC Odyssey Part of World Premiere of "Bette Davis on the Edge"

The Purdue University-North Central Odyssey Arts Series, Festival Players Guild and Michigan City Public Library have united to sponsor a world premiere performance of the new solo play, "Bette Davis on the Edge," at Mainstreet Theatre, 807 Franklin St., Michigan City.

The 90-minute play, written and performed by Christine St. John, is at 7:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday, Sept. 12-13 and 19-20. Tickets are \$20. Call (219) 874-4269 or email info@festivalplayersguild. org for reservations.

Following its opening here, "Bette Davis on the Edge" will transfer to New York City and London, England. It is directed by Jane Brody, with lighting, set and sound design by Duane Thompson, costume design by Anna Glowacki and graphic art by Tim Jarmain-Groves.

The play is set in the early morning hours of Oct. 31, 1962, with Davis anxiously awaiting reviews of "Whatever Happened to Baby Jane?" If the picture is a success, it will hail the desperately needed comeback for her fading career. If not, it will provide a sad and embarrassing epitaph. As she waits, she reflects on her career, from the "talkies" to the present day.

St. John was intrigued by a "situation wanted" advertisement Davis placed in The Hollywood Reporter in August 1962. She subsequently embarked on research at the Motion Picture Academy Library in Los Angeles and Bette Davis Archival Collection in Boston. She intended to create a play that was more than a catalogue of showbiz reminiscences. The result was "Bette Davis on the Edge," packed with drama, intrigue and comedy.

The work is St. John's first play. A graduate of The Goodman School of Drama of The Art Institute of Chicago, she furthered her studies at the Sorbonne and The American Center, Paris, with Blanche Salant. She has appeared in numerous productions in the U.S. and United Kingdom.

She lived in London for the past 24 years and was a founding member of the touring group Act 3 Theatre Co., performing in the works of Noel Coward, Anton Chekhov and adaptations of Edith Wharton. She has been involved in theater in development projects in Ethiopia and India, and has been a Fellow at The Royal Geographical Society in London since 1993.

Director Brody is an award-winning stage director, master teacher, former actress and casting director. Her passion for the past 30 years has been helping and developing actors. She founded the Chicago Acting Studio in 1980 and has been a casting director since 1986. Her casting company, Jane Brody Casting, now known as Paskal-Rudnicke Casting, was instrumental in casting movies and TV shows such as "Groundhog Day," "The Women of Brewster Place," "A League of Their Own" and "Public

Enemies." Her students include Michael Shannon, T.R. Knight, Alex Koch, Christine St. John, Peggy Roeder, Adam Brown, Melissa Peterman, Eric Stonestreet and many others.

A unique twist of events brought "Bette Davis on the Edge" to Michigan City.

After one Chicago theater didn't work out for the play, St. John and Brody started looking for a suitable place for it. During a visit to Chicago's Royal George Theatre, a friendly couple seated in the lobby offered a helpful solution to their problem: hold it at Mainstreet Theatre. Making the suggestion were Jan and Marian Dick. Jan is acting president of Festival Players Guild.

Brody was familiar with the theater, so she and St. John accepted an invitation to tour the theatre.

"I realized almost as soon as I walked in the door of Mainstreet that this was a very special place with creative and imaginative people," St. John said, "and so when Mainstreet agreed to present my play, nothing on Earth could have made me happier.

"The moral of this story is that one should always talk to strangers in lobbies, and that there are no strangers," Brody added.

To celebrate the world premiere performance, Michigan City Public Library, 100 E. Fourth St., is hosting a free "Bette Davis Film Festival" featuring films that span Davis' career. The schedule is:

- Saturday, Aug. 30, at 1 p.m., "Of Human Bondage" (1934), followed at 3 p.m. by "What Ever Happened to Baby Jane?" (1962).
- Saturday, Sept. 6, at 1 p.m., "Dark Victory" (1939), followed at 3 p.m. with "All About Eve" (1950).

STRONG ATTENDANCE, TALENTED ARTISTS FIGHLIGHT LAKEFRONT ART FESTIVAL

The Lubeznik Center for the Arts presented the 33rd Lakefront Art Festival on Aug. 16-17 in Washington Park.

There were large and small families attending this popular summer event. I decided to interview people.

Approaching me was a lone woman with a pleasant smile: Cindy Pender from Oak Lawn, Ill., who was visiting a relative near Michigan City, but spending the afternoon at the festival, then eating lunch at a Michigan City restaurant. "Will you be in town all day?," I asked. "Yes," she replied. I suggested she attend the 3 p.m. Michigan City Chamber Music Festival concert at First Presbyterian Church. She heartily thanked me, telling me she'd go and enjoy it.

Next, I met a mother with her son and daughter from Cedar Lake, Ind.: Dana Bogathy with Madeline, 14, and Owen, 12. With her bright red hair, Madeline stood

out from



There were 200 applicants for the more than 100 artist booths on the premises. About 30 of the selected artists were new to the festival this

year. In the competition, winners were judged on four criteria: craftsmanship, excellence in concept and design, originality and booth display. The competing artists were judged by select people from the community with expertise in their fields.

Prize winners or not, all the artists admitted to the event are very good, because this is a juried event. That means they all passed a juried application process to become part of the festival. Through this selection, there are a variety of artists and a balance for all of the six categories of art.

Now, for my interviews with some of the artists.

Maggie Joyce won a blue ribbon for her Jewelry-Recycled Optic Lenses. Her business card reads "Recycling @ Its Prettiest. Optic Lens Jewelry by Maggie Joyce, Chicago — lenzlady2002@Yahoo. com." She makes very artistic jewelry with ecology in design. It was her first time here. She does about 25 to 30 shows per year. Her jewelry line includes earrings, slides and nuggets. After being processed, the colors are absolutely gorgeous. A repeat custom-

er from Michigan City, Nolah (Nasser) Gertner, said, "I came back once and then I came back again. It's hard to find anything this well done."

Gertner was selecting a slide or nuggets to go with some jewelry she'd just purchased at the booth.

Jimmy Langford from Georgia won first prize last year and this year with his sculptural objects. His wife, Connie, was with him. Last year was his first time at the festival. Asked if he did well, he replied, "Sold a couple of paintings and I won a prize.

"You never know how well you've done until it's over. A customer in the afternoon yesterday bought four big paintings.

"I've been selling my art work for well over 30 years, actually. It's a positive experience. Today is the best weather we've had for the show."



Amanda Joyner exhibited hats under the "Wearable Art" category. She received first-place awards last year and this year. Her hats are unique headpieces, from artistic to everyday wear. She does a lot of shows, and appears at the Grammy and Emmy awards and other galas. There was a display of feathers to choose from to decorate your individualized hat.

"Business here has been good so far and was excellent last year," Joyner said. "Of course, my favorite pieces are the first to go. It's always the one you love the most that sells the fastest!"

The colors she used were bright and beautiful, and the items used to decorate each hat were fantastic.

Anne Hanley showed her watercolor/mixed media works in the Two-Dimensional group. When I asked,



"How many years have you been doing this?," her reply was, "Too many!" Her business card was post-card size and had 18 small colored sections from that number of her works. A Batik artist, she lives and works in Wheaton, Ill. Her award-winning paintings have been shown in galleries, juried shows and exhibits through the Midwest. She uses a tjaunting tool to render shapes on a rice paper surface. Then, alternating washes of watercolor paint and hot wax are applied. She is inspired by elements found in nature. Her beautifully colored work is a joy to be-

hold. She won first prize in her category.

Roberta Hummel from Middleville, Mich., entered her mittens under the Wearable Art category. gorgeous colors. practical, her fun and totally unique recycled mittens are quite distinctive. This was her seventh year at the festival.

ternoon," she said. "Sales are going well. A lot of people who Christmas shop love my mittens because they keep your hands warm."

She recalled me taking shorthand when I interviewed her at a previous festival. She also won second prize in her category.

When I spoke with LCA Marketing Director Amy Davis Navardauskas, on the phone a few days afterwards, she said total attendance was just around 4,500 for the two-day event.

"The artists and everyone else were happier with the weather on Sunday, which was a cooler day," she said. "Every year, we do a survey to find out how the artists feel about the current year's These event. results have to be entered, then compiled and analyzed, so it will be a while before we have the actual results.

"When we do, we can figure out what to do to improve our next festival. However, we were really pleased with all the crowds, and we want to thank the artists for coming out and being part of the occasion."

The last time I wrote a column for a paper was a long time ago, in a galaxy far, far away, for the Crimson Comet.



Place the sliced peaches in a food processor and mix until smooth.


Add 2/3 cup of sugar, and once the sugar and peaches are well blended, slowly add one cup of cream and blend until the mixture turns a consistent lighter color.



Also, the JROTC will participate in the seventh season of CyberPatriot's National Youth Cyber Defense Competition.









THIS WEEK IN HISTORY



On August 28, 1774, Mother Elizabeth Ann Seton, the first American born person to achieve sainthood, was born in New York City.

On August 28, 1833, the British Parliament, 27 years before the start of the American Civil War, banned slavery throughout the empire.

On August 28, 1922, New York's radio station WEAF broadcast the world's first radio commercial. The Queensboro Realty Company, of Jackson Heights, paid \$100 for ten minutes of air time.

On August 28, 1963, approximately 200,000 people, who had gathered for a peaceful civil-rights demonstration in Washington, D.C., heard Dr. Martin Luther King deliver his famous "I have a dream..." speech.

On August 28, 1989, John Cotter, founder of the True Value Hardware chain, died at the age of 85.

On August 28, 1996, the troubled 15-year marriage of Britain's Prince Charles and Princess Diana ended officially with the issuance of a divorce decree.

On August 28, 2008, Illinois Sen. Barack Obama became the first African-American to receive his party's nomination for president when he was officially confirmed at the Democratic National Convention in Denver.

On August 29, 1896, chop suey was invented, and first served, at a restaurant in New York City. It has since become a mainstay of Chinese restaurants.

On August 29, 1965, *Gemini 5*, piloted by astronauts L. Gordon Cooper and Charles Conrad, returned to earth after eight days in orbit.

On August 29, 1966, at San Francisco's Candlestick Park, the Beatles gave their last concert.

On August 29, 2005, Hurricane Katrina hit the Gulf Coast near Buras, LA; the resulting floods devastated the city of New Orleans. Nearly 1,000 people died in Louisiana alone.

On August 30, 30 B.C., Cleopatra is reported to have committed suicide by holding an asp in her hand and encouraging it to bite her on the breast.

On August 30, 1929, Colonel E.H. Green took delivery of a newly designed combination gas and electric automobile built by the General Electric Company of Schenectady, NY. It was a 60-horsepower vehicle that had no clutch or gear shift. Two pedals, one on each side of the central brake pedal, were used for acceleration.

On August 30, 1983, Guion Bluford Jr. became the first black American astronaut in space, blasting off

aboard the space shuttle Challenger.

On August 30, 1993, "The Late Show With David Letterman" premiered on CBS.

On August 30, 2002, baseball averted a strike—the first time since 1970 that players and owners OK'd a collective bargaining pact without a work stoppage.

On August 31, 1887, Thomas A. Edison received a patent for his Kinetoscope, a device that produced moving pictures.

On August 31, 1888, Mary Ann Nicholls was found murdered in London's East End in what generally is regarded as the first killing by Jack the Ripper.

On September 1, 1859, the first Pullman sleeping car was placed in service on a train operating between Chicago and Bloomington, IL.

On September 1, 1875, novelist Edgar Rice Burroughs, creator of the jungle born *Tarzan*, was born in Chicago.

On September 1, 1945, Americans received word of Japan's formal surrender that ended World War II.

On September 1, 1972, in a drawn-out match held in Reykjavik, Iceland, American Bobby Fischer won the international chess crown, defeating Soviet player Boris Spassky in their final match.

On September 1, 1985, the wreck of the *Titanic*, a British luxury liner that went down in 1912, was located 370 miles south of Newfoundland by French and American scientists.

On September 2, 1752, when the Gregorian calendar was adopted, it was necessary to make an adjustment that dropped eleven days. September 3 is a day that never arrived in England, and neither did the 10 days that should have followed. This decision caused severe riots because the people were convinced that the government had stolen 11 days of their lives.

On September 2, 1930, the first non-stop airplane flight from Europe to the United States was completed in 37 hours.

On September 2, 1963, "The CBS Evening News" with Walter Cronkite was lengthened from 15 to 30 minutes, becoming network television's first half hour nightly newscast.

On September 3, 1894, Labor Day was celebrated (as a legal public holiday) for the first time in the United States.

On September 3, 1951, the TV soap opera, "Search for Tomorrow," made its first appearance on CBS. It was to run continuously for 35 years, the last five on NBC.

On September 3, 1976, Viking II, an unmanned U.S. spacecraft, landed on Mars, taking the first close-up photographs of the planet's surface.





Off the Book Shelf

Bellweather Rhapsody by Kate Racculia, (hardcover, \$25 retail in bookstores and online)

A colorful cover and an enticing title, and I'm reaching for this book. Add to that murder, mystery and music, and you have the trifecta for a most entertaining read.


The Bellweather was a behemoth resort built in the 1920s in the Catskills of New York State. It had an auditorium, library, shops, indoor squash courts and a rooftop swimming pool with a glass ceiling. Sadly, its day has come and gone, and now, its only claim to fame is the yearly Statewide Music Festival. High school students in voice, orchestra and band converge

to show off their skills, meet and greet old friends, make new ones and sow a few teenage oats.

Our story opens in 1982 with a flashback to a wedding gone horribly wrong. Room 712 was to be the honeymoon suite for a newly wedded couple. Instead, it became the scene of a murder/suicide as the bride shot her husband, then hanged herself in the room. No one knew why. The unlucky person to get off the elevator on the seventh floor and discover the husband's body in the hall, as well as the open door to the bride's demise, was a 12-year-old girl. Something like this could haunt a little girl for years and years, don't you think?

Our story now jumps 15 years later to November 1997 and the latest Statewide Music Festival. Dozens of boys and girls are flooding the lobby as they arrive to get settled in their assigned rooms and head down to rehearsal. We first meet twins Alice and Rabbit Hatmaker. She's a vocal prodigy, he's an amazing bassoon player, and very particular with his instrument. He even named it Beatrice. They arrive with their chaperone, Natalie Wilson. She was a former piano prodigy who spent several years at Statewide, but now she's head of the music program at the twins' high school. She's also a woman with a past no one knows about.

Others we meet are: Harold Hastings, the concierge and a strange man who has worked at the Bellweather for years and now lives there; Jill Faccelli, a flute prodigy very full of herself; and her mother, Viola Fabian, even more full of herself and a real witch who nobody really wants to know. However, they have to know her as she's the new interim head of the festival. Then, there's Fisher Brodie, another person the kids don't want to know who's the orchestra conductor, a last-minute replacement for the suddenly collapsed regular conductor everyone



liked. One session with Fisher was all the orchestra needed. He was nasty, rude, impatient...well, you get the picture. And, he knows Viola. I guess like attracts like.

Jill and Alice turn out to be assigned roommates in — wait for it — room 712.

So, the first few chapters set the stage: teen hormones, angst and phenoms, and their narcissistic ways, and the music — always the music — in an old hotel far from the city lights with a room that just might be haunted. Did I mention there's also a blizzard on the way that will trap everyone inside for several days?

Stick around, there's much more to

come.

Jill has a breakdown in the room with Alice and spills wine all over the bedspread. Alice leaves the room to get cleaning supplies and comes back to find Jill hanging from an extension cord — quite dead. She runs for help and comes back to an empty room, save for a note that says, "Now she is mine."

Now, all the pieces begin to fall in place. All the players have secrets to hide, and some have relationships they would like to keep hidden. Racculia's characters have more layers than my mother's seven-layer salad, and the story builds to a climax like the crescendo of a great musical piece.

This story is different. I like different. The author charges us up with the music that leads people in different directions and changes them forever. I love the way she has listed the various parts of the story as a musical program. Prelude: Andante Misterioso, Scherzo Agitato, Allegro Furioso, Grave e Cantabile, Postlude. Brava Ms. Racculia!

The author grew up in Syracuse, N.Y., and received her master of fine arts from Emerson College. Her first novel was <u>This Must Be the Place</u>. She lives in Somerville, Mass.
