Set in Stone

Legacy of "The Village Architect" Kept Alive by Generations of the Same Family

The Sutherland Building at 809 Jefferson Ave. in downtown La Porte.

The Sutherland Building stands in downtown La Porte, a grand pile of Indiana limestone built in the imposing Romanesque style.

Large, rough blocks of stone cemented together by convex layers of mortar artfully and symmetrically form a solid structure built to survive for generations. The fortress-like edifice rises two stories, supported by thick stone walls decorated with arched windows and carved niches. A grand entry door, arched at the top and surmounted by a stone lintel, beckons all to enter.

The building at 809 Jefferson Ave. was constructed in 1897, financed by Dr. Orlando Sutherland. The structure's massive walls and grand façade were conceived, designed and planned by George Wood

Allen, recognized by the citizens of La Porte as "The Village Architect."

The Sutherland building's history is intertwined with the story of Allen and his family. It is a history that, one could say, is written in the stones of the past and is still alive with us today.

Allen had a dream and, most importantly, a plan for his life. He was born June 5, 1864, in Milton, N.J., a distant cousin to Ethan Allen of the famed "green mountain boys." George Allen had immense energy and passion for life. He learned the masonry trade from his wife's grandfather, and through this work a love and appreciation for the beauty and versatility of stone emerged.

In the poem "My Goal," composed later in life, George wrote:

When I was young just learning a trade I set a high goal and did not try to evade, But worked the harder to make the goal, A good mechanic was an honor I was told, After many months this was acquired, Was able to do a job one would admire. To be a master craftsman was the goal set, So I hewed to that line to gain a signet.

George had a talent for art and attended Northern Indiana University in Valparaiso in 1891, studying art and math. In 1894, he and his wife, Ida, moved to La Porte to set up trade as an architect.

The people of La Porte, up until that time, used generic, purchased plans for their public buildings. Allen, with his knowledge of stone and various types of masonry work and artful designs, found an immediate field for his services. He was able to supply the demand for designs for residences and public buildings that were grand and attractive. Soon, it would be difficult to find a street in La Porte that did not show some evidence of his work.

In addition to his legacy as "Village Architect," Allen was an artist and draftsman. He created hundreds of drawings and floor plans for the buildings he imagined, thus making his dreams the stuff of reality to be constructed in brick and stone.





Allen was a poet and writer, publishing 23 books in his lifetime. He also was an amateur printer, producing many publications on a hand press in his home. He received many honors during his lifetime, including membership in the American Institute of Architects. This honor brought him into contact with the finest minds in the field, including Frank Lloyd Wright.

Allen's son, William Marion Allen, joined the firm at 21 and worked throughout his lifetime in La Porte, continuing the tradition and love of stone his father passed down to him. He created many fine designs for buildings that still exist today in La Porte.

George Allen's grandson, William Martin Allen, grew up in La Porte and eventually came into his own with a love of art. With the same affinity for the beauty and durability of stone, he became a landscape architect. His creations often used stones as accent pieces, and his artistic viewpoint allowed him to create landscapes pleasing to the eye. Allen's nursery was a La Porte fixture for many years.

William Martin might best be known for the unusual home he created in La Porte. He spent years on the lookout for the perfect rock, which he wanted to make the focal point of his home. He finally found what he was looking for in a 45-ton granite monolith.

This stone was moved to his property, with no small effort. William Martin had the rock sandblasted to bring out its inner beauty, then had a groove sandblasted across the stones meridian so that he could set glass windows in place. The stone sat half in and half out of the Allens' home with a window sealed across the groove at its center.

Continuing in his love of stone, William Martin collected rocks from all 50 states and used them to form a massive map that was the floor at the base of the rock inside the house. Each state capitol was lit from below. Each state was made from polished native stone from that state.

George Allen's great-grandson, Jack, is an artist and craftsman in his own right. Using the ar-

tistic talent passed down through the generations, he creates beautiful stained glass windows with his daughter, Tina Allen-Pierce, in a shop in La Porte they call The Vintage Rose. Jack travels the world repairing and restoring old stained-glass windows.

In 2012, Dr. Thomas Allen, a clinical psychologist and the son of Jack Allen and great-great grandson of George Wood Allen, was seeking office space in La Porte for his practice. The Sutherland building, which had been empty for three years, went on the market and Thomas Allen purchased it for his use.

Thus, George Wood Allen's passion for stone and quality design to last through the ages eventually housed the dreams of his descendants.

Many months and much elbow grease were invested in restoring the old building. Great care was taken to preserve the original intent of the interior woodwork. The original façade survived for generations and was still beautiful, but the surrounding grounds needed to be restored. Through skills handed down through the generations, this was done.

When the building was complete, Thomas Allen invited his father, Jack, and sister, Tina Allen-Pierce, to relocate their business to the historic

Among his many interests, George Wood Allen was a genealogist. Studying the course of his family's history was a passion. It's been said that while the past intrigues and is a useful study, it is the future in which we find our destiny. George Allen and




his family have proven this by reaching for their dreams and applying their talents for the common good over many generations.



"In Utter Awe, He Stood and Stared"

Editor's note - The Lincoln Funeral Train committee is presenting stories once a month about the 2015 event.

As the 150th anniversary of President Abraham Lincoln's assassination and funeral approaches, The Historic Railroad Equipment Association has been preparing for a recreation of the path the president's funeral train took from Washington, D.C., to Lincoln's hometown of Springfield, Ill., in 2015.

One of the final stops was in Michigan City on May 1, 1865, which will be recreated in 2015.

It was raining in Michigan City on May 1, 1865. But boys, like flowers, thrive on rain. And 10-yearold Martin was no exception. He and

his buddies were born in Germany and with their parents emigrated to the U.S. In this country only half a year, the boys found summer jobs helping farmers plant potatoes. The boys weren't aware on that first day of May of the significant things happening in their new country. When they heard the booms of cannons ringing out, they thought Michigan City was under attack by Confederates. They weren't aware the Civil War had already ended. When they went to investigate, they found themselves amid townspeople crowded at the Michigan Central rail station.

As a curious boy, Martin tried to enter the train, but was told he wasn't allowed without his parents. So instead of being rebuffed, he hid under the big hoop skirt of a woman getting on the train with her husband. Once on the train, Martin emerged from his hiding place and was assumed to be the son of the couple. After moments of suspenseful expectation, Martin came upon the source of all the excitement. At just 10 years old and a new citizen of America,


> he immediately was aware of the significant sight before him.

"In utter awe, he stood and stared," holding up the line of people. Then, the spell was broken as he was grabbed by a soldier and marched off the train, dumped into

train, dumped into a sand burr patch. As the little German boy stared back at the soldier, he could hardly imagine what his life had in store.

Years later, Martin Theodore Krueger grew up and served six terms as mayor of Michigan City and four terms as a state legislator. His mind often returned to that day — May 1, 1865 — when the train carrying the president's body paused here on its 1,662-mile journey from Washington to Springfield, where the fallen president would be buried.







My Wish List by Gregoire Delacourt (oversize paperback, \$15 retail in bookstores and online)


What will you lose if you win the lottery? Sounds like a contradiction in terms, right? You might just rethink the whole "if only I could win the lottery" thing after reading this No. 1 French novel — more than 500,000 copies sold in France alone — now translated into English and published in 25 countries.

Jocelyne Guerbette is a 47-yearold housewife and mother feeling the pangs of middle age. She feels fat, ugly and unwanted by her husband, along with two grown children who don't visit much anymore. They phone her once in a while, as if it's a duty they must perform.

Jocelyne owns a fabric shop in a small town in France. Her next-door neighbors in the shopping district are twin sisters who run a beauty shop. The girls always buy a lottery ticket every week, hoping for that big win that will take them away from the drudgery of their lives. They keep bugging Jocelyne to buy a ticket, too, until one day she finally does...and wins \$25 million (more than \$18 1/2 million in euros). "The figures made my head spin," Jocelyne says.

She is speechless, yet she cannot bring herself to tell her husband or anyone else that she won. She thinks about her life and how the money could make things better for her family, so she makes a wish list of what she might do with the money. Her first list contains things of necessity, like a coat and hat stand, new microwave, even a potato peeler. Her next list amps it up just a little. This one contains a vacation for her and her husband, a Chanel bag, Louboutins, maybe a Porsche for her husband and a Peugeot 308 for herself. Hmmm. Sounds like her expectations are beginning to rise.

Jocelyne visits her father in the nursing home.



He's the only one she can confide in because his Alzheimer's only gives him six minutes of lucidity at a time, then it's back to "who are you?" Her secret is safe with him. These conversations give Jocelyne a chance to really think about the things she could buy with this windfall, and how they will affect her life. All kinds of questions pop up in her head, and she begins to wonder, is all this money really necessary for a happy life? Does money make us happy, or do we make our own happiness?

After looking back at her life up until now, and much soul searching about the money (she's hidden the check in a shoe), she comes to a conclusion:

"I think of myself, of all that will now be possible for me, and I don't want any of it. I don't want

what all the money in the world can buy. But does everyone feel like that?"

Indeed, does everyone feel like that? I don't think so. I think most of us think that kind of money will solve all our problems instantaneously and give us lifelong security.

What Jocelyne finally decides may surprise you... or maybe not. Anyway you look at it, this dilemma will give you food for thought and make a heck of a book discussion.


