Creating Hats is an Art Form for Amanda Joyner

reating a hat sounds like it would be a quiet struggle in dexterity.

For Amanda Joyner, however, that is not quite the case. You might recognize her by her flamboyant alter ego, Chef Bizzaro,

through whom she's endeavored to not just be a hat maker, but a truly great one.

Like so many art forms, a blueprint or plan is the starting point for crafting a hat. Joyner is always sketching, and her husband, a pastry chef who has dabbled in sculpting, is supportive of her vocation.

"He gets it," she says simply, a streamlined response encapsulating the great bond and understanding that marks a healthy marriage. "If the kids are rambunctious, he watches them."

A portion of the creative process that produces noise is called "blocking." After Joyner has selected a material — "some seem to have a mind of their own," she says — she selects a wooden block that serves as a shell for the style of the hat. It could be a derby, fedora or any number of varieties. All told, Joyner has about 15 blocks, which she typically acquires from the United Kingdom, where hat making remains quite prevalent. The trade is taken so seriously there, milliners must have a license of certification.

Now, that noise mentioned earlier comes into play when the material is stretched around the block. An exceptional amount of force, and back-and-forth slam motions, create the sounds, as well as the shape of the material.

The process, Joyner says, can be frustrating.

"You can go into the studio with all these grand plans, but once the material is in your hand, sometimes it just doesn't want to do what you want it to," she said.

"Today, I went in hoping to block all these hats, and the material and hands just wouldn't work with me," she added, noting when that happens, she moves on to other steps or projects.

Like many artists, Joyner places considerable pressure on herself. Some days, little seems to get accomplished, but, she said, "there are days where everything just clicks and you get everything done. whole process from blocking to sewing just flows and time just melts away."

Part of Joyner's aesthetic comes from her sense of humor. Her Etsy website (www.etsy.com/shop/ ChefBizzaro), which played a pivotal role in not only her develop-

ment as a maker, but also in garnering her recognition and sales, says it best: Seriously, Unserious Millinery.

The other facet of her art traces back to old Hollywood glamour.

While growing up in San Antonio, Texas, Joyner spent considerable time with her grandmother, as her mother was a working single parent. Her grandmother was a watercolor painter, prompting her to paint as well, but what captured the young woman's attention, and continues to inspire her, is Hollywood musicals she'd watch with her grandma.

"The first scene in 'Easter Parade' (the 1948 Judy Garland-Fred Astaire film) goes into a hat shop, and each model talks about how the hat makes them

feel," she said. "Some really great hats! That is probably the movie that started it. That's my favorite part about musicals. The hats. The clothing. So that really started my love for it."

Joyner began pursuing hat making after a hat that retailed for several hundred dollars online caught her eye. Her husband said he thought she could probably make it, so she tried.

"I started with just a glue gun, cardboard, messing around, and people started buying them off my head," she said.

From there, she joined a few craft shows, but her aspirations were bigger. She pushed herself to learn more by reading as many millinery books as she could find. The online community on Etsy also was instrumental for learning since she could cross paths with other milliners from all over the world.

"They're really great because we all help each other," she said of the group of which she's now become a respected leader.

Joyner's penchant for humor and whimsy was on full display during an early breakthrough moment when she did a Milliners of Etsy show a few years ago at The Acorn Theater in Three Oaks, Mich. After raising about \$1,000 through a Kickstarter cam-

paign, Joyner set to work for months creating hats that were representations of different scenes from the David Bowie-Jim Henson movie "Labyrinth."

"It was probably the most fun I've had," she said.
"The community has always been so great in supporting me."

Another gratifying moment for Joyner, who still finds herself surprised by her sales, arrived when a representative from Disney World responsible for coordinating events bought a slew of her hats. Not only did Joyner make a custom order of mermaid motif hats, but Disney also provided Joyner and her family with a VIP vacation experience.

Up until recently, Joyner still called a portion of her basement at home her studio. There would be many late nights, and moments where Joyner would sneak off to sketch or work on her ideas, all while she could hear the sounds of her children's feet scampering above her.

Seizing a potential opportunity, Joyner recently

moved her workspace — she was joined by friend Julia Nielson into a storefront on the main floor of the new Artspace Uptown Artist Lofts, 717 Franklin St.

"It's already made a huge difference," Joyner said of having the designated workspace away from distractions.

Joyner said each new hat is an opportunity to push her skills forward and learn something new. Her biggest challenge is overcoming her inner critic, and she's thankful

for the support of her husband, and her best friend and now business partner, Nielson.

And, of course, everyone who buys her hats.

"If you would have told me where I'd be today, I would never had believed you," Joyner said. "Most of where I am today has to do with the local community, social media and really working my Etsy shop to its full potential. It's insane to think of some of the people I have made hats for in my career already."



Vickers Screening Set for Video Spotlighting Three Oaks' E.K. Warren

A special preview of a new video celebrating the life of Edward K. Warren, Three Oaks' most prominent citizen, is planned for Saturday, May 28, at Vickers Theatre, 6 N. Elm St., Three Oaks.



Producer Nick Bogert, as well as local talents Garth Taylor and Rachael Collins, who composed and performed the film's musical score, will attend the screening to discuss the creative process.

Bogert is a communications consultant and freelance TV producer for NBC Network News who spent the last 30

years reporting the news in the Miami area. He has relocated to the Midwest, where he divides his time between Chicago and Lakeside.

E.K. Warren was an inventor, entrepreneur and philanthropist who was born, raised and educated in Three Oaks. His Featherbone, which became a sensation around the world because of his advertising savvy and the utility of his product, built a local industry that employed hundreds and made a fortune for the Warren family. The wealth and business acumen he willingly shared with the commu-

nity helped the community thrive.

It was said at the time of his death that Warren "stood for honesty of purpose, industry and an unimpeachable manhood. Achievement without honor was nothing to him."

Warren gained worldwide fame as a fundraiser and drew attention to Three Oaks in 1899 when he brought the Dewey Cannon to the village, and invited U.S. President William McKinley to speak at the dedication ceremony.

Bogert created the video for The Region of Three Oaks Museum with the aid of members of the Three Oaks Arts and Education Center.

Melrose Park Gets New Lease on Life

On a cold spring morning, Kendra Bartlett strings up signs at a construction site. Beyond a bright orange fence is Melrose Park, which up until a recent collaboration housed a sparse selection of equipment unchanged for about 40 years.

A tiny red sock found beyond the barrier betrays the overeager excitement of some child. Bartlett's signs ask folks to stay out

of the park until it's ready. The signs also promise a grand opening in the coming weeks that includes fire trucks, snow cones and popcorn.

Renovations, which cost roughly \$200,000, include a freshly poured rubber surface — an innovative, safe and cost-effective improvement that meets Americans With Disability Act standards. A basketball hoop, tetherball court and other final touches will be made soon, bringing to a close a project about two years in the making.

"We couldn't have done this by ourselves,"

Bartlett, Long Beach Park Board president, said. Jeff Oltmanns of Global Engineering and Todd Bell of Woodruff Construction were vital to the project's success, she said, along with other committee members Joy Schmitt, Jane Neulieb and Bill Hazelgrove.

Bartlett said the community's response has been great.

"They love it," she said.

"That's why I put these signs up. The kids keep coming to play, sneaking in and jumping the fence."

Bartlett said the newly installed surface is not supposed to bear any weight for seven days after installation.

"The parks and the beachfront are really all we have," Bartlett said. "We wanted to do this well. Do it right. Do it once."

And so, the planning, persistence and hard work have paid off.

Now, it's time to play.

Meals on Wheels — A Labor of Love

This is a story of people helping people, and of the joy of giving and being neighborly.

Five days out of every week — rain or shine, sleet or blizzard — for the last 42 years, volunteers have gathered to deliver hot, nutritious meals to neighbors unable to leave their homes or cook for themselves. It is a labor of love and a neighborly concern that is the driving force behind this Michigan City institution of giving.

To date, 1,423,350 hot and nutritious meals have been delivered to our neighbors in La Porte Coun-

ty, folks who otherwise would not have the advantage of a warm meal and a visit from a friendly face.

La Porte County Meals on Wheels began as an idea back in 1973 when the pastor of Michigan City's Immanuel Lutheran Church challenged his congregation to aspire to a service that would live beyond their own lifetime and serve their community. The Sunday school class was more than inspired. Galvanized into action,

they began studying where they could best serve and what the community's needs were. Meals on Wheels, an established charitable organization, was suggested and agreed upon as the vehicle for their service project.

We must always look with admiration towards those who, in times of distress, look not to help themselves, but ask of themselves, "What do my neighbors need?"

The idea of a program for delivering meals to

the elderly and shut-ins was formulated in Great Britain during World War II. During the dark days of the war, when German planes performed regular bombing runs on English soil, many homes and residences were destroyed. Very often, ordinary citizens, including women and children, were left on the streets unable to prepare a hot meal. At this time, The Women's Volunteer Service for the Civil Defense, a volunteer organization formed to recruit women into the Air Raid Precautions Service, realized the need and responded by cooking and deliver-

ing meals to those who lost their homes. Records show the volunteer group helped more than 10,000 people every night during the war.

While firemen and male civil defense volunteers fought fires and cleared rubble, The Women's Volunteer Service set up mobile canteens to serve refreshments to those on the frontlines of the work, as well as to families who lost their homes and sought shelter anywhere it was available.

These mobile canteens became known as "Meals on Wheels," and a tradition of service was born.

The idea was carried to the United States after the war and was established in Philadelphia in 1954 as the first home-delivered meal program for shut-ins and elderly people in need. The organization finally grew to what today is known as Meals on Wheels America.

What was born as a challenge put forth to the congregation of Immanuel Lutheran Church in 1973





became a reality on March 11, 1974. After much study and consultation with other church groups, doctors and local charitable organizations, Meals on Wheels Michigan City began serving its first meals to five clients. The organization expanded and applied for funding under the Older Americans Act. A grant was approved under the condition that Meals on Wheels Michigan City would grow to encompass all of La Porte County. In 1975, the name was changed to La Porte County Meals on Wheels Inc.

Today, it is an organization of dedicated volunteers headed by Executive Director Cheryl Daurer. The mission is "to provide the Greater Michigan City Area with nutritional meals for people who find it difficult to purchase or prepare nourishing meals for themselves."

Daurer stresses that she and her band of volunteers are an inclusive, rather than an exclusive, organization; in other words, it is the goal to seek out and offer assistance to anyone in need.

A visit to the group's headquarters in Michigan City's Old Central School on any given weekday morning will find a bee hive of activity. Meals both hot and cold are planned and prepared by a dietitian at Meals on Wheels of Northwest Indiana in Merrillville and delivered to Michigan City early each morning. One hundred twenty five people are served each day in the Michigan City and Westville areas over 11 separate routes, all originating from the Old Central School, all delivered by enthusiastic, energetic volunteers.

These specially prepared, nutritious meals are made available to the handicapped, disabled, elderly and those having difficulty preparing their own meals. They can even be provided to folks in short-term or long-term recuperation after hospitalization. This often is a great help to families who struggle to balance work with caring for loved ones.

Of this small group of individuals, who give of themselves in time and effort each week, Daurer says "without them, none of this work would be possible."

Each weekday, Daurer and her group must organize the meals in approcontainers, load them in cars and send them off with individual drivers to be delivered to folks who look forward to their visit each day.

Daurer, and extension her volunof hope to so many who

would have to go without if it were not for Meals on Wheels. Forty six percent of those served daily would not be able to stay in their homes if it were not for this service.

And as important as that service is, the volunteers pride themselves in the personal contact and friendships they make through daily visits. These visits serve to lift the spirits of those who can no longer easily get out of their homes and into social situations. They also serve as a daily wellness check for those most elderly on each route.

A sampling of comments from the Meals on Wheels website reveals the impact the program has on local residents.

One elderly woman writes, "Before Meals on Wheels I was not eating properly and lost a lot of weight. With meals delivered I don't have to worry about how I will get to the store, especially in winter. I don't have to worry about preparing meals which, being alone, I don't always do. All the volunteers are wonderful people. Very nice and friendly. Sometimes

Another client writes, "Dear Meals on Wheels, My mom loved getting meals delivered by your friend-

ly staff and she made many new friends. Thank you for the joy you brought into her life."

Here is a final and most touching comment: "What a blessing to know that Meals on Wheels is available when you need it."

Such personal attention and loving care is a service beyond price. Many might wonder what the cost would be to themselves or a loved one to have

Meals on Wheels deliver a hot meal to their home daily. The good news is that the personal attention and friendship extended is free thanks to the kind hearts and giving spirits of the volunteers who make this service possible.

The cost of the food is calculated on a sliding income scale based on actual food cost. Every client is subsidized in some form, and all contributions are used to help pay for the food. In the end, the average cost per person is under \$25 per week, which is much less than what would be spent on weekly trips to the store.

Meals vary each week and are delivered hot and fresh. Each day, a choice of either one of two hot meals is offered, as well as a cold sandwich for a snack. Consider a sampling of the menu for a few days in May: vegetable lasagna, chicken/cheery salsa, paprika chicken with sour cream gravy, panko tilapia, meat loaf with gravy.....and many, many more selections, all served with a side of bread and milk. Meals fit for a king (or queen). Special meals

are available as ordered by the recipient's physician.

How is all of this made possible? By the selfless sacrifice given by many friends and neighbors, volunteers willing to make a difference for good in their community. Contributions, gifts and memorials are

also welcome and tax deductible.

Beginning June, La Porte County Meals on Wheels will sell jumbo jelly beans as a fundraiser. Daurer says by purchasing a bag, you get a "sweet treat and deliver hot meals to people in need." These special jelly beans will be available at: Hoity Toity, Revive, Uptown Cakery and other local stores.

If you would like to volunteer

• Free Dunes Photo Workshop from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Friday, May 27, at Indiana Dunes Visitor Center.

Learn the best techniques and times for photographing the dunes, and how to get the most out of a digital or film camera, from famed dunes photographer David Larson. The workshop does not include a field trip nor a camera. Larson's exhibit, "Fifty Years of Indiana Dunes Photography," continues at the center through Sept. 5.

• Mount Baldy Sunset Hike from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Friday, May 27.

While Mount Baldy remains closed to unrestricted public access, visitors can join a ranger for a special guided hike along a trail on the dune's western edge found to be free of holes. When Political Correctness Sabotages Enjoying Time-Capsule Entertainment

Bryony Hannah in "Call the Midwife."

In a film packed with one uproarious sight gag after another, the most audacious in the classic disaster-spoof "Airplane" (1980) has Barbara Billingsley translating "jive," spoken by two black passengers, to a befuddled, white as white bread stewardess.

Barbara Billingsley. June Cleaver herself. The all-American, stay-at-home, middle-class mother. The joke isn't mean-spirited, but rather pokes fun at the actress' squeaky clean image.

If "Airplane" were made today, that scene would *never* make it into theaters. We are a culture that has imbibed the entire batch of politically correct Kool-Aid. In some respects, that's a good thing. It means using a people, an ethnicity or a gender as the butt of a joke or the crux of a sociopolitical

agenda is unacceptable. The double-edged sword, though, is that there is no middle ground. We exist today as polar extremes, so fearful of offending, the ability to engage in intelligent discourse gets lost.

For years, I thumbed my nose at political correctness. Two recent experiences, however, called into question whether the progress we've made as a society has hampered my ability to place historical entertainment within the proper context?

What comes to mind is a recent episode of "Call the Midwife," airing Sundays on PBS, in which kind, mousy Sister Mary Cynthia (Bryony Hannah) is brutally attacked, her face reduced to a bloody pulp. She survives the incident, her spirit remarkably unbruised. But as the episode ended, I turned to my wife, disgusted, and said, "Really? This

is what they do to the show's sweetest character?"

I had a similar reaction when the equally endearing Anna Bates (Joanne Froggatt) was raped during Season Four of "Downtown Abbey." I vented afterward through a facebook post, questioning why the show's creators would do this to the character? More than half the women who responded to my post tore me a new one, inquiring if I was suggesting that only "bad girls" get attacked.

My response, and I stand by it, was this. I am Generation X. We expect women to kick ass, not wiggle it. We are the ones who embraced Sigourney Weaver's Ripley 30 years ago. Nowadays, we champion Daisy Ridley's Rey from "Star Wars Episode VIII: The Force Awakens." Seeing women victimized feels like a wretched anachronism.

We cringe, too, at the sight of actors of color rel-

egated to insignificant background roles. John Boyega's Finn, for example, joined Rey as the unsung heroes of "The Force Awakens," while Chadwick Boseman's Black Panther is so compelling in "Captain America: Civil War," he's getting his own spinoff helmed by "Creed" director Ryan Coogler.

That's why, when my family and I recently ventured to La Porte High School to see the daughter of good friends in a production of the 1936 comedy "You Can't Take It With You," I sighed when two black cast members arrived on stage, reduced to playing "the help." My gut reaction was, why would they pick a play where these are the only roles for black students? The ignorance of that question was

fueled by having never seen the Pulitzer Prizewinning play, nor the 1938 film that won Oscars for Best Picture and Director.

So what's going on here? What's happened to me, so readily dishing out alarmist responses, first to "Call the Midwife," then to a high school play.

It appears I stumbled from the path my history professor father encouraged me to follow. Placated by society's progressive changes, a simple truth bespoken by my father has eluded me, that we must understand where we've come from, and how we've progressed, to better appreciate where we are today, and where we must head in the future.

The characters of "Call the Midwife" live in the turbulent '60s, when issues of feminism, contraception and women's health could no longer be swept under the rug. The two black characters of "You Can't

Take It With You," truth be told, are the sanest indi-

viduals amid the crazy family that propels the frenzied story.

And as much as we sometimes view the past with

And as much as we sometimes view the past with rose-tinted glasses, ugly truths remain. Women were violently attacked...and they still are now. People of color faced insurmountable hurdles...and challenges persist today.

Stories like the ones in "Call the Midwife" need to be told. And when they are, I must remind myself not to behave like a reactionary old poop. Every glimpse into the past offers illumination into our struggles as a people, and the strides we've made through each passing decade. And that, indeed, is entertainment worth championing.

Questions to the Fitness World





In the world of fitness, there are millions of questions and millions of different answers. What's important is finding out what works best for you.

Everybody is different and every BODY is different. What works for your friend who just lost 50 pounds may not work for you. Going back to your middle-school science class days, you learn about experiments and all the different variables that can change it. Your body has variables that can change your results from someone who looks, weighs and maybe even feels exactly like you.

The same goes for outside variables. Work, family, income and time. Wait, scratch that last one. Time. As Zig Ziglar said, "Lack of direction, not lack of time is the problem. We all have 24 hour days." I do not see time as a variable. So to give some perspective, below are four questions common in the fitness world. I hope you cull from them great info for your personal fitness journey.

Question: It seems like every workout I read about has an exercise called the burpee. What exactly is this exercise, and why it is important to do?

Answer: The burpee is most well known for be-

ing performed during a boot camp-style workout or sports conditioning team practice. But if performed correctly, the burpee can be one of the most effective and complete whole body conditioning exercises in your program. In its most simplistic form, the burpee is a four-step movement that targets the chest, shoulders, arms, core, glutes and legs. This variable impact, high-intensity exercise will raise your heart rate, burn calories and enhance your endurance. From a standing position, squat down and place your hands on the floor. Step or jump your legs back to a high push up position (the start of a push up). Step or jump your feet forward as close to your hands as possible, then stand up and repeat the sequence. Once you have established this sequence, you can add a push up or jump up in the air after you stand up.

Question: My work schedule has changed and I will need to switch my workouts from evenings to early mornings. I've never been one to work out in the morning and need some advice on how to stick to my exercise program.

Answer: Changing your exercise time will be challenging at first, but since you already have exercise as part of your weekly routine, these three tips should help you make the transition from evenings to mornings easier. Schedule in exercise like you would your dentist appointment or a work meeting. Write it down in your calendar or smartphone and set a reminder alarm for the night before. Be sure to review your calendar and ensure you get plenty of sleep the night prior so your workouts are effective. Try moving your alarm to the other side of the room so you'll have to get up and get out of bed to shut it off. Once you're up, it'll be much easier to get moving. Give yourself enough time to eat a small snack (a banana, toast with peanut butter or a handful of almonds) and drink coffee (if you normally do), plus drink at least one glass of water on your way to the gym. Lastly, lay out your workout clothes the night before and pack your gym bag so you are ready to go and can get out the door quickly and stress free. Exercising in the morning is a great way to get your day started and check a very important 'to do' off your list!

Question: I drink a vanilla or chocolate protein shake every day. I like the taste, but I'd like to add some flavor without adding too many extra calories. Can you suggest some simple add-in ingredients that I could buy at my local grocery store?

Answer: Bananas, peanut butter, honey, cinnamon, vanilla extract, rolled oats and many of your favorite fruits are easy add-in ingredients that will mix it up with your protein shake. You can satisfy your sweet tooth and reduce post-workout inflammation with this chocolate and cherry combination:

combine chocolate protein power, 1 cup of skim milk, 1 banana and a cup of fresh or frozen dark cherries. Of course, there's nothing better than the perfect mix of chocolate and peanut butter to curb a craving: Combine chocolate protein power, 1 cup of skim milk, ½ banana and 1 tbsp. of peanut butter. Vanilla protein powders work well with a variety of fruit. Turn your shake into something you drink poolside by adding vanilla protein power, 1 cup of coconut milk, 1 cup of frozen raspberries or pineapple and 1 tsp. coconut extract for a tropical treat.

Question: I am tired of doing the same old running and elliptical for cardio. I've heard the rower is good for cardio. Do you have any advice on the proper way to row, and what I can expect from working out on the rower?

Answer: Rowing machines provide a low-impact, variable intensity cardio option that works virtually every major muscle group in your body. Whether you are training for cardiovascular fitness or focusing on building muscular strength and explosive power, with every stroke, you will feel the legs, hip, glutes, along with the muscles in the upper back, shoulders and arms. The great thing about rowing is the way it forces you to counteract your normal daily posture (rounded shoulders and shortened hip flexors); proper rowing technique opens the chest, strengthens the back and uses a great range of motion in the legs. An efficient rowing stroke has three steps: (1) focus on pushing with the legs first, (2) lean back slightly so your shoulders pass your hips, and (3) pull the arms in toward the chest.

Reverse the order to return to the starting position and repeat. Avoid rushing the stroke. Rowing is about efficiency; you will get better with time! If you are just getting started, begin with 8-10 minutes of rowing, gradually adding time each week.

Helping Children at the Heart of Shopping Tour, Auction

Winter weather and Christmas are not what most people think about on Memorial Day weekend. Rather, it is a time to begin enjoying summer activities. For some, however, those two words are part of their vocabulary all year long.

The La Porte County Association of Realtors and La Porte Jaycees work hand in hand to coordinate various fundraising events to help the La Porte County De-

serving Children Shopping Tour.

It is believed the first fundraiser for what is now known as La Porte County Deserving Children Shopping Tour was held more than 40 years ago during a Christmas party at a local Realtors' home. Today, raising money is a year-round effort for the LPCAR and La Porte Jaycees, one that begins in January and ends in December. The cycle begins again each January.

Some events the organizations have planned for this year are the Charity Auction, the Jaycees Roof Sit, bake sales, bowling tournament, Spire Farm-to-Fork cooking class, Kabelin's Dogs for Dollars and Buffalo Wild Wings Give Back Night.

In addition to attending these events and supporting them financially, there are numerous ways to help.

One is by donating either new, unique or antique items for the Charity Auction, held in October. Donations are accepted round. Last year, the auction expanded by reaching out to businesses in the community seeking corporate sponsorships. The same approach will occur this year.

Monies raised



from these events then are used for the Shopping Tour, which takes children living in La Porte County shopping.

"It seems as if the need is greater now than it has been in the past," LPCAR President Bernie Connors said. "Many children have nothing, thus the shopping night provides them with basic necessities such as boots, shoes, a winter coat and clothing to wear to school. Our goal in this is to not see a kid

walking down the street without a coat on."

The shopping tour success depends not only on its fundraisers, but also on the willingness of community members to donate their time to take a child shopping. Last year, more than 700 children in La Porte County participated in this program.

"We work with the schools, and the churches, Stepping Stone and some of the shelters to find all the children that need our help," Connors said.

The shopping event is held on two evenings in early December: one night in La Porte, the other in Michigan City. At the event, children are treated to a meal, a Christmas stocking filled with toothpaste, toothbrush, hat and gloves and a visit with Santa. The children then shop with their volunteer chaperone.

"We need your help taking children shopping." Connors said. "We do get local fire departments, police officers, teachers — a lot of those people do step up to the plate volunteering. If they didn't, this would not happen.

About the Cover

When Linda Williams contacted me in April about considering Dan Sheehan's photo for our Memorial Day edition cover, she did not mince words.

"I think you will concur that it is stunning."

I'd had the pleasure of working with Williams before. The Long Beach resident shared one of her poems with us for our Easter edition cover.

and we'd begun conversations about the "Remembering Michigan City's Forefathers" piece that appeared on our May 19 cover.

I clicked on the link she provided...and my jaw dropped in awe at the photo before me. We've all driven by the Washington Park monument on countless occasions but, truth be told, we tend to take it for granted, focusing instead on our destinations within the park.

Sheehan's photo, however, which bathes the statue in gorgeous pre-dawn hues, helps restore the grandeur the monument deserves.

"Rest assured," he told *The Beacher*, "my photograph of this magnificent structure did not come without persistent experimentation.

"From the very first time I saw how the female figure at the top didn't just have her arm extended, but instead was aggressively reaching as if trying to forcibly make a point, I knew I would do everything possible to get a memorable photograph."

Sheehan says he "literally stalked" the monument, photographing it throughout the day and under various atmospheric conditions. However, he was not satisfied by the results.

"One morning, I began photographing the monument two hours before dawn and noticed how only the lower half of the monument was lit by the existing spotlight," he said. "I supplemented the existing artificial lighting until I discovered which camera settings worked best to fully illuminate the monument. The final result is the photograph you have."

After a successful entrepreneurial career, Sheehan retired to pursue his artistic interests. He first picked up a camera 10 years ago while living in Arizona and has not put it down since then. His photographs have been used in calendars, textbooks and advertising campaigns.

And now, thankfully, the cover of The Beacher.

Volunteers are excited to kick off the 2016 season at Hesston Steam Museum where trains, including the 67-ton 1929 Shay logging locomotive, depart from a replica 1900s-era depot.

It's all part of the Memorial Day festivities at the beloved attraction, 1201 E. County Road 1000 North.

Continuing every weekend throughout the summer, visitors can choose from three different trains, from miniature to full sized. Each train heads along a different route through a beautiful wooded land-scape, the longest being 2 1/2 miles.

The museum officially opens at 11:30 a.m. and runs until 5 p.m. Train fares are \$5 for adults and \$3 for children 3-12.



The Buchanan (Mich.) Preservation Society opens its 2016 summer season with two events Saturday, May 28, running concurrently with Downtown Buchanan's seventh annual UnSanctioned summer kick-off.

vation Society will host a book-signing celebration and reception in Robandt's store, 114 E. Front St. Author Donald Ryman has released a new edition of "Buchanan's Heritage." Originally published in 1984, this edition has updated and new articles and images chronicling Buchanan's Greek Revival and Italianate architectural heritage, as well as the struggle to save Pears Mill.

Robandt, the Preservation Society president, stressed the research time spent working with Peter Lysy, the Buchanan District Library Local History Collection volunteer archivist, in identifying, then finding as many of the original images used in the book as possible.

Ryman came to Buchanan from Har-

vard Law School and the U.S. Navy in 1957 when he began an almost 40year career





WEEK IN HISTORY



On May 26, 1521, Martin Luther was banned by the Edict of Worms because of his religious beliefs and writings.

On May 27, 1995, actor Christopher Reeve was paralyzed when he was thrown from his horse during a jumping event in Charlottesville, Va.

On May 28, 1683, the first black regiment from the North left Boston to fight in the Civil War.

On May 28, 1798, Congress gave President John Adams the authority to recruit a volunteer army of 10.000 men.

On May 28, 1929, in New York, the first all-color talking movie, "On With the Show," made its debut.

On May 28, 1934, in Callender, Ontario, Canada, the world famous Dionne Quintuplets: Annette, Cecile, Emilie, Marie, and Yvonne; the first known quintuplets to survive early infancy, were born to Elzire Dionne.



Field Trip Grants Available

Educators interested in taking students in grades K-12 on field trips to an Indiana state park or statemanaged lake during the 2016-2017 school year can receive financial help through the Indiana Natural Resources Foundation.

The Discovering the Outdoors Field Trip Grant Program is for public, private, parochial or homeschool educators. It was established in memory of Tom Huck, a longtime DNR employee and ardent supporter of outdoor experiences for children.

Since its inception in 2013, 67 grants have been awarded, providing the opportunity for more than 4,500 students to visit state parks at less cost to the schools and students.

Indiana has 24 state parks and eight state-managed lakes eligible for field trip funding that will engage students in learning about Indiana's fish, forest, wildlife, natural habitats and conservation.

The maximum grant award is \$250 per application. Applications are accepted through June 30 prior to the school year for which the grant is requested. Applications must be postmarked no later than June 30. Recipients will be notified by Aug. 1 regarding potential awards.

Off the Book Shelf

The Lost Airman by Seth Meyerowitz with Peter F. Stevens (hard-cover, \$27 in bookstores and online; also available as an eBook)

For this year's Memorial Day issue, I wanted to do a special book review — a book that would mirror what the holiday is all about. And that, of course, is remembering the men and women, both living and deceased, who honorably served in our country's Armed Forces.

To that end, I found this recently published book that is the story of one man who not only served his country admirably, but never gave up even though the odds were certainly stacked against him.

Along with my grandfather, who served in World War I, my father, who served in World War II (the European Theater), and my brother-in-law, who served in Vietnam, I would like to honor the memory of U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Arthur Meyerowitz of Bronx, N.Y. Here is his story as told by his grandson, Seth Meyerowitz.


Arthur was born in 1918 in the Bronx to David and Rose Meyerowitz; younger brother, Seymour came along in 1927. A year after high school, Art's interest in airplanes lead him to an Army recruiter who said he could sign up for one year and switch to the Army Air Corps after basic training and become a pilot. Well, he lied. The army didn't waste time on pilot training for someone who signed up for only one year. But, guess what? Pearl Harbor happened at the end of his one-year enlistment, and Art signed up immediately for three more years.

He then was accepted for pilot training and sent to Texas. There, an unfortunate accident caused damage to Art's left eye. An operation saved his sight, but it was no longer 20/20 — pilot training out. But he could still be accepted as an engineer on a fighter plane. He completed training as a top ball-turret gunner and was promoted to staff sergeant.

Sent to England, Art completed his first mission and was to make his second on Dec. 31, 1943. Over France, heading for their destination, the plane was hit and had to be abandoned. Art landed in a tree, cut himself out of his parachute and landed on the ground, hurting his back, an injury that would hound him the rest of his life.

By this time, France was occupied by the Nazis. Luckily, Art made it to a farmhouse where the couple there took him in, a task they had done before for other downed American and British airmen.

This is when Art witnessed firsthand the fierce loyalty to their country many Frenchmen had as he learned about, and began to meet, members of the French Resistance. He had landed near the town of Lesparre in southern France. His best bet for sur-



vival was to make it through Spain, a neutral country, to Gibraltar, which was taken over by the British.

There is a map in the book that shows the route Art traveled, along with the date of his arrival in each town. It would be 6 1/2 months before Art was safely in British hands. More than six months of agony for his family not receiving any information about Art, except that he was "missing in action."

Art's story is a harrowing one of survival. Always led by brave members of the Resistance, they had to dodge Gestapo agents and Nazi sympathizers. Sometimes hiding out for days in someone's attic, sometimes hiding out in

plain sight as a deaf mute named Georges Lambert. Marcel Taillandier, legendary head of the French Resistance network known as Morhange, saw to it that Art was protected, fed and lead on to the Pyrenees Mountains, where others took over for his race through Spain. Spain might have been neutral in the war, but local police could still be bribed, and many worked hand in hand with the Nazis to return Allied soldiers to France and the Gestapo.

I walked every step with Art and couldn't help holding my breath when he came close to being discovered...I held my breath a lot.

You don't have to be a history buff to appreciate this true story of one man's fierce determination to live. One man, one mission gone bad, one chance to make it to safety. His love, loyalty and perseverance are what made him part of "the greatest generation."

A number of photos show Art and some of the French people who saved his life. One poignant photo shows Art's son, Mark, in France in 2013, with Pierre Delude, a Resistance fighter, one of the men who helped Art along his way.

Seth Meyerowitz spent much time researching to tell his grandfather's story. Copious notes and references at the end of the book show how he combed through government records, personal letters and other correspondence, as well as personal interviews.

Author Jack Cheevers wrote: "The Lost Airman is a deeply researched, finely wrought gem."

Meyerowitz is a web entrepreneur and the president of a global online marketing company. After traveling the United States speaking on behalf of Google for its Get Your Business Online program, his web and marketing savvy allowed him to unearth the declassified saga of his grandfather.

Stevens is an editor, journalist and author of 11 books.
