

# The Perfect Shot

Two years ago, pop singer Lorde headlined opening night at Chicago's Lollapalooza. Sixty-five photographers were approved to cover acts over the four-day music fest. Only 10 were allowed to photograph Lorde.

Bobby Talamine was one of them.

When Lorde took to the stage, it was sprinkling. Within seconds, the raindrops were quarter size. By the end of the first song, the rain was coming down horizontally. The entire photo pit had at least six

inches of water, yet two photographers remained, one being Talamine. If Lorde was still singing, he was not leaving.

Talamine knew the shot he wanted, so he slowed everything down on the camera, occasionally raising it from underneath his coat to take a photo. Into the second song, the promoters heeded the warnings to close Lollapalooza.

Once his equipment was dry, he looked at the photos. Talamine had captured a jaw-dropping shot

that ended up in *Rolling Stone*.

Music is Talamine's heart and soul. His mantra — music first, photography second — rings true even after 40 years of photographing rock 'n' roll's greatest artists.

A professional photographer since 1982, Talamine's success did not happen overnight. It was accomplished through years of practice, patience and perseverance. Today, he is a premier music photographer, having photographed nearly 4,000 artists in all genres and musical categories.

His goal when taking photos at a performance is walking away with the shot no one else took. He does his homework to figure out how he can accomplish that.

Each photo Talamine takes has a story he enjoys sharing, making him a fascinating storyteller, so much so that in certain cases within this article, we decided to let him share these stories in greater detail. They are noted in *italics*.



Talamine realized the trick to capturing exactly what Gene Simmons wanted was *where* he took the photo during the performance.

For instance, when asked about what his homework entails, he shares the story of Gene Simmons, bassist and co-lead singer of Kiss, the song "Firehouse" and the iconic shot.

*Here's my homework: Doc McGee, manager of Kiss, controls the band as far as promotions and publicity. Eight years ago, Kiss is on the road, Simmons requests a photographer to catch him with his*

*new torch and fireballs. The torch is flaming, he's got kerosene in his mouth and he blows kerosene at the torch, creating these fireballs. The crowd loves it.*

*I know for a fact the tour started two weeks earlier. Doc calls me and cuts to the chase. No one seems to be able to get the photo Simmons wants. We're going to give you a shot.*

*I'm up for the challenge, but I'm freaking out. I have a week and a half to figure this out. I can't tell by the pictures I'm seeing what the problem is. Why is everyone getting crappy shots of the torch? Why is no one getting this shot? If Doc McGee is calling me, I don't want to fail. I don't want to be the photographer to screw this up.*

*I'm now having sleepless nights because of this. This is all that's on my mind: why, why, why is everyone failing on getting this shot of the torch and Gene Simmons, one of the most popular people in rock 'n' roll. It hit me at 2 in the morning. I need to be elevated. I was dreaming it three dimensions in my head. Everyone is shooting from the photo pit up. I'm going to kill this shot. I call Doc at 10 a.m. the following morning. I tell him I need this section: row and seats. I gotta be above Gene. Doc makes it happen.*

*Gene blows the kerosene at the torch. The fireball comes out phenomenal. The actual uncropped image is the whole dome of the fireball. It looks like a nuclear bomb went off.*

*To this day, no one has taken this shot like I got it.*

Talamine's journey to become a respected, sought-after music photographer began through self-discovery at a young age. Living in Lincolnshire, Ill., he was able to experience numerous opportunities

in Chicago.

Although he never played an instrument, music was an integral part of his life. Turning pages, as his mom played the organ, immersed him in classical music.

Talamine likens his musical growth to the movie "Almost Famous" (2000) and the lead character, budding journalist William. His widowed mother did not approve of current music. Alone, he would flip through his sister's hidden collection of vinyls. Liking the cover, William would listen to the record.

Talamine's situation was similar: a widowed, strict Catholic mom, rebellious sisters hiding their music, him flipping through vinyls, loving the covers, then listening to the music. Alone, he loved listening to the symphonic nature of rock 'n' roll in the early music of Moody Blues, Leonard Cohen and Joni Mitchell. Once he heard the massive symphony sound from the mellotron, he began to delve deeper into music.

As a youngster, his mother also saw him reading camera journals. Encouraging him, she purchased a Pentax SLR camera, leading him to discover the visual on his own. His first photos were all about patterns.

"It was like I would see micro, not macro," Talamine said. "I would see in a radius of 8 yards patterns in the sidewalk, patterns in the bark of a tree, patterns in the stem of a flower, patterns, uniformity, chaos in the uniformity, how can I control it, how can I make this composition unique."

Delving into music photography came when he perused monthly magazines promoting rock 'n' roll in the late '60s-early '70s. The photography on the covers of Circus, CREEM and Trouser Press captured his attention. Talamine was hooked.

At 14, he gained access to the photo area at the 1974 Led Zeppelin "Physical Graffiti" tour. One person there was Neil Preston, Led Zeppelin's premier photographer and likely the most famous music photographer in the '70s. Keep in mind, this was at a time when the restrictions or photo pits were not what they are today. Having a camera was the only thing one needed.

Talamine recognized Preston from his photos, but did not introduce himself. He shadowed Preston throughout the concert.

"I became a pest in that three-hour time frame of working with Led Zeppelin," Talamine said. "I loved the band. I have shots of that experience, but they're crap 'cause it was my first show live. They're in my basement. They haven't seen the light of day, nor will they ever 'cause they're embarrassments. However, I was watching what Neil was doing."

He made notes of everything Preston had, from the number of lenses, to the rolls of film, to the type of camera and camera case he was using. Talamine realized he had his work cut out for him. At the end of the day, though, he had photographed his first famous musicians. To this day, he credits Preston for being a NIKON user.

One of his favorite jaunts in the early '80s was Wax Trax!, the largest industrial music label in the U.S., located in the heart of Lincoln Park. After his job as a waiter at The Art Institute of Chicago, he would head to the label's record store, to its upstairs boutique devoted to posters, memorabilia, magazines and alternative fashions.

It was there he found the weekly music magazines from the

United Kingdom. Through the covers of *Melody Maker*, *NME* and especially *Q*, he learned about U.K.'s popular artists, such as David Bowie, Echo and the Bunnymen, Bryan Ferry of Roxy Music. He realized bands breaking in the U.K. were six months ahead of their popularity in the U.S. Upon their arrival at Chicago venues such as Metro Chicago, Vic Theatre or Medusa, Talamine was there and already familiar with them.

Talamine also was figuring out his photographic style. Looking at his competition, he chose to emulate Anton Corbijn, a Dutch photographer who made his name by shooting black-and-white still photography. Talamine spent a good amount of money purchasing film, learning how to shoot black-and-white film in live conditions.

"Ironically because of constantly going to the boutique and figuring out the bands on the verge of breaking here in the states," Talamine said. "I built up a portfolio that piqued the interest of two main publications that were interested in my work: *Alternative Press* and *B-Side Magazine* (as well as) *Wax Trax! Label*. The bands are asking, who is this guy? Who took this cool shot? How come no one else is getting this?"

Amid mastering his craft, Talamine learned the reality is, surprises always exist in rock 'n' roll photography. He limits the unexpected by becoming familiar with the venue, the personnel affiliated with various aspects of the performance and by studying other's photos before stepping into the photo pit.

"I would say, there's probably 22 hours of me discovering and observing and editing and figuring out before I shoot the band," Talamine said. "I want to know every quirk, habit — you name it."

For instance, Pink Floyd's laser shows are captured using a high-speed camera. The photographer

has to be still and the shutter speed slowed down. Typically, half the song is lasered. In that two minutes plus, Talamine will shoot about 110 images. With luck, he may get two good shots.

Glitzy shows like Beyoncé, Madonna, Lady Gaga, Camila Cabello and St. Vincent are more of a theatrical production, which are well-lit, planned out and choreographed,

making their shows so much easier to shoot.

Black Sabbath presents unpredictable challenges, partially due to the animated activities and "kindergarten" behavior. Their color scheme — lots of reds — makes it difficult for white balancing and achieving good contrasting images. He averages between 75-110 photos per song. Usually, groups have an 18-22 song list, which adds up to about 1,300 photos taken by the end of the concert. He is lucky to get 30 usable ones.

Opportunities abound as well for him to speak on his craft. When before students, Talamine is tough, but honest. When asked how they can shoot a specific musician, his response is simple and blunt: You can't. One might think that's a harsh comment, but it is spot on. Talamine is trying to get across it takes time and effort, along with patience and perseverance, to get to the level of shooting a famous musician successfully.

He recommends students instead turn their sights onto the local summer festival scene in the Chicago area. There are numerous events every weekend he encourages them to attend, to learn and fail there, to put in their time and effort learning their craft. The rest will come.

For Talamine, it has never been about the big acts.

"Do I shoot the big acts? Yes. Do I do 30 shows a year? Do I like shooting them? Yes," Talamine said. "Do I equally like shooting shows that are 40 people or 200 people in attendance. Yes, and probably more than the bigger acts. I like shooting that and developing a relationship and a rapport with a band that's breaking."

Keeping his ear to the ground, he continues looking for new artists through online blogs such as Consequence of Sound, Pitchfork and Aquarium Drunkard. To keep up with all the new bands on the market today, Talamine also relies on dear friends, Scary Lady Sarah, William Faith, Greg Corner and Joe Shanahan, who offer recommendations on up-and-coming artists.

He still researches these artists, listens to their music and connects with them. More times than not, he is the only one shooting them. Once he has gotten to know them, he can capture their essence. The photograph then becomes the “plum.”

One thing Talamine does not like is rejection. In his world, tenacity must be his middle name. He shares two stories: one of Leonard Cohen, the other of Bob Dylan.

*Leonard Cohen left the music scene to embrace his religious beliefs. Sadly, during his time away, his manager robbed him blind. When he came back having nothing to his name, he began touring in the late '70s. He was in Chicago.*

*The restrictions on the photographers shooting at this particular venue were unacceptable. Photographers were allowed to shoot the first 30 seconds of the first song, then they had to leave the venue.*

*I took matters into my own hands. There was no way that was happening. I told them, I'm not leaving this venue You tell me who is your boss and bring him to me please. At this point, I'm screaming and making a scene, asking if Leonard Cohen even knows about this. Lo and behold, there's Leonard Cohen walking by. Did you hear me there, I know you're a famous singer/songwriter and I look up to you. I'm the same way about photography. You may not know me, but I want to let you know something Mr. Cohen. I will get a shot of you that will knock your socks off, and I mean that with all sincerity. He goes, who are you? My name is Bobby Talamine, rock 'n' roll photographer from Chicago, Leonard nice to meet you.*

*He's looking awkwardly at his manager, assistant manager, at security in the lobby, then says, 'Bobby, be discreet,' and he walked away. The manager goes, 'I guess you're the lucky one, you're going to shoot all the songs tonight.'"*

If you know anything about Bob Dylan, you will appreciate this story from Talamine, but at the same time, you can see his don't-mess-with-me attitude.

*My last encounter with Bob Dylan was the most*

*awkward of the three, to the point that I felt Dylan was ready to give me the finger. Understand that Bob Dylan bases what few interviews he gives on questions he has seen beforehand so there are not any surprises in interviews. He is very guarded. The challenges for a photographer are the time limits placed on shooting photos of him.*

*Case in point: I was given 3 minutes 50 seconds to shoot a posed shot of Bob Dylan, then I had to leave. It was a take-it-or-leave-it situation.*

*The clock is ticking, and here is Bob folding towels, then tinkering with stuff on the keyboard. Finally, he walks away from the keyboard and stops at the lip of the stage. I have my camera at my side. I'm looking at the clock and it's 3 minutes 10 seconds. Now it's 2 minutes 10 seconds. It's getting more awkward. The manager asks, 'Are you going to take your camera and photograph Bob or not?' I go, 'I might,*

*I might not.' It's now awkward. Bob starts walking up stage. I go, 'Bob, I got a minute 10 with you, get back over by keyboard please.' Bob does and is mad. I get asked again about taking the picture. I have 50 seconds. He's getting angrier and poutier. I say, 'Bob thank you, those are the shots I wanted. Under his breath, you heard, (expletive) photographer. That was in 2014, and the last time I spoke or did any work with him.'*

Fortunately, Talamine has photographed Dylan more than 30 times and has ample photos, including his transition from electric guitar to keyboard.


Is Talamine always this confident? Yes. He does not view what transpired with either Cohen or Dylan as confrontational.

"I've come a long way with my gear," Talamine said. "I'm totally invested in your music. The photography will show that. We'll reciprocate in kind. Do you want to pass that up? It's your loss."

Talamine's most powerful moment, and photographic coup of his career, happened at the O2 arena in London on May 12, 2011. He was the photographer for Roger Waters' "The Wall" tour in the states. Rumors abounded that David Gilmour would make an appearance at some point. When it did not happen that fall, Talamine realized it probably would in London.

He requested permission to shoot all the shows at the O2 arena. Even though he had worked with Waters and his son, Harry, he still had to go through the approval process.

"The response back was not harsh," Talamine said. "This is a very unusual request. Why are you requesting all five dates? I was polite. No. 1: I'm probably going to be the only Yankee photograph-

ing from the states; No. 2: I think I've shown my worth with what I have done for Roger in the states for the 30 dates we had to do the photography; and No. 3: I'll get the shot in capital letters."

Waters, the creative force behind Pink Floyd's "The Wall" and Gilmour, who wrote the song "Comfortably Numb," had been engaged in legal wrangling for several decades and not spoken.

*The reunion came about because Polly Gilmour, David's wife, has a benefit once a year in England in regards to cancer prevention. David asks Roger if he would like to sing an acoustic song with him to promote the event. Roger accepts, but asks David to reciprocate. Roger tells him 'The Wall' tour is going to be in London for five dates in May 2011, which is four months after this thing with Polly and the benefit. I want you to play electric guitar for the song 'Comfortably Numb.' A day later,*

*David calls back and says, 'I'll do it, but you can't tell anyone which of the five dates, only you, me and the band. No one can tell, no one can know that I'm going to be up there on stage doing this for you.'*

*So here we are, opening night of Day 1 of 5 in the O2 arena. I have never seen so many photogs in the pit at one time in my life. You could not move. What are they approved for? First three songs, no flash, leave venue...with gear out the door.*

*'Comfortably Numb' doesn't even come in until after album No. 2, after the intermission. 'Comfortably Numb' is after 'The Wall's' already been built in the show. The fourth thing I had stated was I want all songs. If there's trouble with this, talk to Harry and he will approve.*

*I was granted the request.*

*Day 1. I am the only photographer in the pit for all the songs. I'm the envy of the world. It didn't happen. His regular tour guitarist was at the top of the wall. Day 2 comes along...I'm there and Roger at the right time says, 'Look up'. Lo and behold, there's David Gilmour at the top of the wall singing 'Comfortably Numb' and I'm the only photographer in the pit shooting the whole thing.*

*Meanwhile, the wall is massive. I can't take the shot from the pit; the wall is 60' high. I run to the back of the venue. As I'm running back, I'm seeing all these grown men crying in their seats because the reunion finally happened. It was an*

*overwhelming experience just watching the fans in the crowd breaking down in tears.*

Talamine captured the iconic shot, which ran in nationwide media outlets such as *The New York Times*, *USA Today*, *Rolling Stone* and *Classic Rock*.

Since music comes first for Talamine, losing iconic musicians such as David Bowie and Prince leaves him wondering what music we are missing because their lives were cut short.

Talamine was fortunate to have shot photos of Bowie at least 10 times, recalling that his shows were magical. Bowie in the last two years of his life recorded numerous songs and was able to get a lot of music released. With Prince, the suddenness of his death leaves him wondering what more Prince

could have done. Seeing the evolution of his music, Talamine believes Prince's last two albums were almost unclassifiable as they were light years ahead of what we are currently hearing.

In his own right, Talamine is a celebrity. He lives in Chesterton with his successful artist wife, Janet Bloch, who is executive director of Michigan City's

Lubeznik Center for the Arts. The idea to leave the city for an area where there is more nature was hers. As long as it was within commuting distance of Chicago, he was OK with the move.

Talamine is proud of what his wife has achieved: the respect people have for her in the community.

"Her heart and soul is for women who are in the arts and promoting said cause for women in the arts," Talamine said. "That it doesn't

need to be a male-dominated thing. What really attracted me to her was when she was in charge of Women Made Gallery based in Chicago. Just the fascination of promoting women in the arts, whether it be sculpture, performance art, regular acrylic art, painting, you name it, and seeing the discovery...seeing her fight the fight with that."

Talamine is not ready to give up his day job as a Real Estate Broker with @properties Chicago, nor is he ready to give up being a music photographer.

"I'm a 21-year-old discovering new music trapped in a 62-year-old body," he says. "Drives my wife crazy, 'cause I'm constantly telling her, 'You gotta listen to this band, man.'"

## Two Big Holiday Movies

“A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood” made my heart full. It is an ode to kindness, with a magical performance by Tom Hanks that is like the shadow of Fred Rogers’ soul.

This might have been a gooey mess; thankfully, it emerges as a beautiful tribute to a man who could halt people in their tracks by having them pause to smell life’s proverbial roses.



### “A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood”

Running time: 108 minutes. Rated PG for some strong thematic material, a brief fight and some mild language

Rather than try to encapsulate one man’s life into two hours or so, “A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood” uses an outsider — a cynic — to introduce its subject. The film is inspired by Tom Junod’s *Esquire* article that detailed how meeting the children’s TV icon profoundly affected him. That is how we get journalist and new father Lloyd Vogel (Matthew Rhys, achingly brittle), who is assigned a piece on Rogers as a national hero. Old family wounds plague Lloyd, so he’s skeptical of Rogers, ready to destroy him if need be, when they meet.

The beauty of Hanks’ performance is its fragile simplicity, its genuine sincerity. Many a celebrity has taken aim at Fred Rogers — remember Eddie Murphy on “Saturday Night Live”? — but Hanks plays him as a man who treats everyone as the only person in the room. He has their undivided attention, his questions spun by heartfelt curiosity. Rogers is the perfect foil for Lloyd who, scene by scene, allows his rocky exterior to erode. And when Lloyd asks Fred if his public persona was a burden to his sons, Hanks’ penetrating gaze, a mix of hurt, understanding and carefully controlled reply, is a brilliant piece of acting.

The whole film, in fact, is a master class in acting: Oscar-winner Chris Cooper (“Adaptation”), grizzled heartache as Lloyd’s estranged father, and Susan Kelechi Watson, proving as she does on “This is Us” she can play the smartest person in the room.

Director Marielle Heller (the brilliant “Can You Ever Forgive Me?”) and writers Micah Fitzerman-Blue and Noah Harpster lovingly capture the cast and sets of Rogers’ show, and they don’t back down from his faith. How can you not be moved as Rogers prays by name for those he’s met, including every member of Lloyd’s family.

I was deeply affected by “A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood.”

The first “Frozen,” when it was released back in 2013, was a rarity: an instant classic. Modern tweaks to a Hans Christian Andersen fairy tale. Animation thrust into a realm of breathtaking beauty. The lightning-in-a-bottle score, punctuated by the Oscar-winning anthem “Let it Go.”

Now, we have the inevitable “Frozen 2,” and it is about as good a sequel as you could ask for, although

all but two of the songs are largely forgettable.

Slightly darker in tone, this go-around is set three years after the original. All seems right in the seaside hamlet of Arendelle...until its past sins return with a vengeance. Seems the grandfather of Anna (voiced by Kristen Bell) and Elsa (voiced by Idina Menzel) played nice with a tribe in the north, then turned on them, leaving both sides trapped in mist-shrouded limbo for 35 years. Elsa hears a mysterious voice calling out to her, the prelude to a new mission that finds her, Anna, Anna’s beau Kristoff (voiced by Jonathan Groff) and their trusty companions, Sven the reindeer (also voiced by Groff) and Olaf the snowman (Josh Gad, still in fine scene-stealing form), tagging along for support.

What’s refreshing about the “Frozen” pictures is the feminist spin by returning writer/co-director Jennifer Lee. These films are less about finding male soulmates and more about women cementing their place in the world: staying true to themselves, and to each other. Lee also has a sense of humor, most notably a playful jab at the played-to-death “Let it Go.”

That song, by the way, and for that fact “Do You Want to Build a Snowman?” and “For the First Time in Forever” from the first film, were steeped in classic musical theater: humable, succinctly advancing the action. That’s not often the case here. A few songs, in fact, stall the momentum. Having said that, when Idina Menzel sings, an entire theater listens. “Into the Unknown” and “Show Yourself” again reveal a performer who can belt out a power ballad like it’s nobody’s business. A hushed silence befell the theater where I saw the film, everyone taking it in with rapt audience. The woman can *sing*.

By the end, “Frozen 2” has spun all the characters together for a rousing finish: a lively race against time as a large tsunami barrels toward Arendelle. Everything we love about these films — the winning characters, robust animation, soul-searching heroics — is on full display. No one can say they were bored by “Frozen 2.”



### How to Cook a Turkey by Everly Magnuson


My family usually buys a turkey, gobble, gobble. My family first cooks the turkey at 600 degrees. Then you take it out and

### **Turkey for Thanksgiving by Ky'Lon Barnes**




Brooke Lakin, who worked in the zoo kitchen, said the day was a great learning experience.





## Fire Science Students Benefit from City's Used Fire Truck

Students from the A.K. Smith Career Center's Fire Science Program are celebrating the donation of a fire truck and other equipment to their program.

The City of Michigan City donated the pumper truck. According to Fire Chief Randy Novak, the truck was brought into service Sept. 11, 2001. Today, it no longer can pass certifications to remain in active use, although it can be driven and has an operational pump. A.K. Smith automotive students already repaired a broken door and stand ready to maintain and repair it as needed.

Tom Thode, who teaches the Fire Science class, was thrilled with the donation.

"We have had field trips and visits from area fire departments so that students can learn about the trucks," he said in a press release. "But this gives us

an opportunity to do hands-on training year-round, every day."

Thode, who also serves as fire chief of the Kankakee Township Volunteer Fire Department, said altogether, 12 city and volunteer departments have donated equipment now used by the Fire Science class. Items include equipment for the engine, hoses, nozzles, hand tools, axes, turnout gear, Self Contained Breathing Apparatus, helmets, gloves, thermal imaging camera, ventilation fans and small firefighting tools.

Fire Departments that have made donations include Michigan City, LaPorte, Kankakee Township, Coolspring Township, Long Beach, Kingsbury, Springfield Township, Lincoln Township, Pleasant Township, Center Township, New Carlisle and Scipio Township.

Audra Peterson, director of LaPorte County Career and Technical Education Program, noted in a press release that the Fire Science program began five years ago in response to a growing need for firefighters in LaPorte County. Twenty-six students from Michigan City City High School and other schools across the county now are enrolled in the class, which provides students with needed certifications and hands-on experience.

The new "old" fire truck is scheduled to make its first public appearance Dec. 7 at the Michigan City Snowflake Parade, which heads north along Franklin Street through the Uptown Arts District.

# THIS WEEK IN HISTORY

**On November 28, 1520**, Portuguese navigator Ferdinand Magellan reached the Pacific Ocean, passing through the South American "Strait of Magellan" that bears his name.

**On November 28, 1839**, Thanksgiving was observed for the first time in Chicago.

**On November 28, 1922**, over New York's Times Square, Royal Air Force Capt. Cyril Turner gave the first skywriting presentation. His message: "Hello USA. Call Vanderbilt 7200." New York's telephone switchboards were jammed, as in excess of 47,000 people did just that.

**On November 28, 1925**, the Grand Ole Opry, Nashville's famed home of country music, made its radio debut.

**On November 29, 1825**, Rossini's "Barber of Seville," the first Italian opera to be performed in the United States, opened in New York City.

**On November 29, 1886**, Chicago's first fireboat, the \$39,000 "Geyser," was commissioned on the Chicago River.

**On November 29, 1890**, the first Army-Navy football game was held at West Point, NY. Navy won 24-0.

**On November 29, 1948**, the long-running "Kukla, Fran and Ollie" starring Fran Allison premiered on NBC-TV.

**On November 29, 1961**, a chimpanzee, Enos, was launched from Cape Canaveral aboard the Mercury Atlas 5 spacecraft, which orbited Earth twice before returning.

**On November 30, 1782**, representatives of the United States and Britain met in Paris to sign peace articles that would bring the Revolutionary War to a close.

**On November 30, 1835**, Samuel Langhorne Clemens, better known as Mark Twain, was born in Florida, Mo. Among other works, he wrote the well known novel The Adventures of Tom Sawyer. This was followed by The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn, considered one of the three or four greatest works of American literature.

**On November 30, 1900**, at age 46, Irish author Oscar Wilde died in Paris. His last remark, a comment concerning his distaste for the wallpaper in his room, was, "One of us has to go."

**On November 30, 1993**, President Bill Clinton signed into law the Brady Bill, which requires a

five-day waiting period for handgun purchases and background checks of prospective buyers.

**On November 30, 2004**, "Jeopardy!" fans got to see Ken Jennings end his 74-game winning streak as he lost to real estate agent Nancy Zerg.

**On December 1, 1880**, the first telephone was installed in the White House.

**On December 1, 1909**, the first Christmas Club payment was made to the Carlisle (Pa.) Trust Co.

**On December 1, 1917**, the Rev. Edward Flanagan founded "Boys Town" in an area just outside the Nebraska city of Omaha,

**On December 1, 1927**, Chicago's first contract airmail plane landed at Municipal (now Midway) Airport.

**On December 2, 1816**, the first savings bank to operate in the United States opened under the name of the "Philadelphia Savings Fund Society."

**On December 2, 1834**, the Chicago Lyceum, the forerunner of Chicago's library system, was formed by a group of book intellectuals.

**On December 2, 1939**, New York's La Guardia Airport began operations as an airliner from Chicago landed at one minute past midnight.

**On December 2, 1942**, below the football stadium at the University of Chicago, a group of scientists, led by Enrico Fermi, for the first time demonstrated a self-sustaining nuclear chain reaction.

**On December 3, 1818**, Illinois became the 21st state to join the Union.

**On December 3, 1833**, Ohio's Oberlin College opened, becoming the first coeducational college in the United States.

**On December 3, 1925**, in New York's Carnegie Hall, George Gershwin performed as a soloist, playing his "Concerto in F." It was the first public performance of a jazz concerto for piano in musical history.

**On December 3, 1947**, Tennessee Williams' play "A Streetcar Named Desire" opened on Broadway.

**On December 3, 1967**, in Cape Town, South Africa, Dr. Christian Barnard performed the first human heart transplant. The patient, Louis Washkansky, lived with the new heart for 18 days.

**On December 4, 1804**, in the Paris Cathedral of Notre Dame, Napoleon Bonaparte crowned himself emperor of France.

**On December 4, 1867**, the National Grange of Husbandry, usually known simply as the Grange, was founded in the United States. This organization of farmers contributed significantly to the development of agriculture, and provided a focus for much of the social life of rural America.

**On December 4, 1875**, New York's William "Boss" Tweed, the former leader of Tammany Hall, escaped from prison while serving a sentence for swindling. He was later captured in Spain.

## Off the Book Shelf

**The Strawberry Thief by Joanne Harris**  
(hardcover, \$24.99 retail in bookstores and online;  
also available as an eBook. 360 pages.)

*“Madame Clairmont thinks I have something called Tourette’s Syndrome...But Narcisse always used to say: ‘Don’t label the child. She’s not a parcel.’”*

Remember “Chocolat”? The bestselling novel made into a popular movie starring Juliette Binoche and Judi Dench. Some years have passed since that story, and now we return to the sleepy village of Lasquenet-sous-Tannes, France. Vianne Rocher still runs her chocolate shop, but changes have occurred: her older daughter, Anouk, has moved to Paris with her boyfriend, Jean-Loup. Her other daughter, Rosette, is at home, sometimes helping out with the chocolate making, sometimes running wild in the woods. You see, no school wants to deal with her “condition.”

*“The school in Agen didn’t want me. They told Maman I wouldn’t fit in, or talk the way I was meant to. And then there was BAM...”* Bam is Rosette’s imaginary friend and constant companion.

When asked by some local mothers how Vianne copes with the child, she replies, *“Rosette is how I cope.”*

Six years ago when she was 9, Rosette met the old man, Narcisse. He had a flower shop and also sold fruits and vegetables. Exploring one day, Rosette followed a path to a wire fence with a padlocked gate. She squeezed her way in, discovering a clearing in the middle of the woods — a circle of stones with an old well in the middle. And strawberries everywhere! It was paradise to Rosette. But then Narcisse found her and scared her away. He came to town later and apologized, saying she could visit anytime she wanted. And so started a wonderful friendship — a lonely girl and a lonely old man.

I tell you this because you soon learn Narcisse is dead, and that one event will dictate everything that happens later. And, to everyone’s surprise, he leaves his beloved woods to Rosette. Because she is only 15, he makes Roux, her father, hold it in trust until she comes of age.

Roux, not his real name because he doesn’t want one, is part of the river people who moor their boats-turned-into-floating homes near the village.

The only person more surprised at Narcisse’s will is his daughter, Michele Montour, a real piece of work. She and her husband, Michel, a property

developer, have been feigning interest in Narcisse, knowing some day they will get hold of his property. Now, all they will own is the shop he ran and his farm, not worth all that much without the woods he gave to Rosette — *“Narcisse has left his sixteen hectares of oak wood to Rosette, and not to his relatives.”* Crime of the century?! You would think so.

The local priest, Father Francis Reynaud, is named executor of Narcisse’s will, along with a package of handwritten pages for his eyes only. As Reynaud reads it, he realizes it’s a history of the deceased — but what is its purpose? He discovers the story of a very lonely young boy, but stops when Michele Montour arrives and demands to see what her father has entrusted to the priest. Perhaps it’s a confession to hidden money?!

Reynaud may never know because the folder is stolen. But by whom? Of course, it’s stolen by Michele, who gives it to her young son, Yannick, to hide, who promptly loses it to...?

To make matters worse, the Montours let the old flower shop to a strange woman who opens a tattoo parlor. In Lasquenette?! Who will go there? Oh, you’ll be surprised.


Everything in Lasquenette has revolved around the chocolate shop, and now, people seem to flock to the newest member of the town — the tattooist, Morgane Dubois — who just might have a connection to Vianne that goes back to Paris — another time, another life ago. Whatever the reason, Vianne orders Rosette to stay away from Morgane.

Vianne and the village inhabitants are a joy to behold. They are funny, jealous, kind, stingy...and they all have a story to tell — they just don’t want it revealed! But secrets have a way of making their way into the open air — *n’est-ce pas?*

There’s something magical about Harris’ writing. Her innate ability is to transport the reader to a timeless place where life is slow and, maybe, dreams do come true — it all depends on how the wind blows. There is a sense of mystery and magic about the place — I didn’t want the story to end!

Harris is an Anglo-French author whose extremely diverse books include 14 novels, two cookbooks and many short stories. She is an honorary Fellow of St. Catharine’s College, Cambridge, and in 2013 was awarded an MBE (Most Excellent Order of the British Empire) by the Queen.
