Betsy Fleek can't help but get emotional when discussing the Indiana University-Bloomington RedSteppers.

Her voice waivers a bit, her eyes rimmed with tears. Good tears, mind you. As one of the dance team's original 24 members, she is part of IU history. When the group celebrated its 50th anniversary during homecoming weekend Oct. 7-8, it did so spectacularly: a halftime performance that featured an end zone-to-end zone kickline, complete with more than 200 past and present RedSteppers. A feat that left everyone packed into IU's Memorial Stadium — including Betsy's husband, Mark Schoonaert, and sister, Susie Pluto — in awed admiration.

So, yes, Betsy's poignant responses to questions about the RedSteppers are earned. In fact, asked how the dance team impacted her life, she pauses, collecting her thoughts.

"It was my very first experience with a strong role model, and strong women who all wanted to do well. To be the very best at what they were," she said. "There was a ded-



ication and a drive. There was no drama. It was just everyone working together, and that has stayed with me my whole life."

□

The RedSteppers' debut in 1972 is all the more significant when you consider, at the time, women were not allowed to perform in the Marching Hundred, IU's esteemed marching band. So, in effect, the dance team was among the first female students to walk the university football field. This feat coincided with Title IX, the federal civil rights law included with education amendments in 1972. It aimed to halt sex-based discrimination at any school or educational program receiving federal funding.

Today, the RedSteppers, led by Coach Brookelyn Wood, are integral to the Marching Hundred, to IU football's game-day experience. Kicklines remain key to halftime performances, along with dance styles that include jazz, pom and hip-hop. The dance team performs at every home game, one away game, two to three volleyball games, two to three soccer games, one to three wrestling matches, two to six bas-

ketball games, clinics, community events, Riley Dance Marathon, Hoosier Hysteria and pep rallies.

For a bit of historical context, IU's Marching Hundred did not begin accepting female students until 1973. So in 1972, Karen Bailey, a professional dancer, teacher and choreographer, contacted the band's director of bands, Fred Ebbs, and colleague Ray Cramer, who would go on to a respected career as a guest conductor-clinician-adjudicator. Her mission: start a dance team to complement the Marching Hundred. Bailey became the group's founder, serving as its director and lead choreographer until retiring in 1992.

Bailey passed away in 2016, her obituary stating about the RedSteppers: *"Her crowning achievements were planning and choreographing half-time shows for all of IU's football games, as well as the bowl games during her tenure, including the Holiday Bowl, Peach Bowl, Liberty Bowl and the Copper Bowl. Without a doubt, her stewardship of the*

RedSteppers was Karen's lifelong passion, as well as the influential impact she made on hundreds of her RedStepper dancers."

For Betsy, a Beverly Shores resident, Elston graduate and Elston cheerleader, joining the new dance team sounded like a blast. In 1972, during her freshman year at IU, she saw a bulletin board notice about tryouts. Auditions involved dividing those present into three groups. Each learned specific dance routines, performing as individual groups, then all together.

How did Betsy feel she did? She laughs when asked.

"In college, I was clueless," she says. "It was sort of like, you go out and you do your all, and you just hope you're going to make the team, but you have no sense of how you've done against others."

Within an hour after tryouts, though, the list of the inaugural RedSteppers was posted. Betsy was among the 24 women selected.

Bailey maintained a rigorous rehearsal schedule. Daily practices from 3-5 p.m., with the dancers first learning the choreography without music, using 8

counts as their guide, then receiving recordings of the music by Wednesday. Fridays involved dress rehearsals on the football field with the Marching Hundred.

Mondays, it should be noted, involved reviewing tapes of the performances, much like football coaches going over game-day footage.

“Karen Bailey was a perfectionist,” Betsy said, “particularly if you were out of alignment, because you were expected to be just like the marching band in terms of where you stood. And, we had white gloves, so it was easy to see if your hands weren’t in line with everyone else.”

Betsy recalls that first rehearsal, on the football field, with the Marching Hundred.

“That gives me goosebumps,” she says. Asked to elaborate on the experience, she pauses. You can see, in her eyes the memory of that day re-emerging.

“I think once we got to line up along the sidelines, where we always started, we knew. *I knew*, that everything was in place. We were as good as we were going to get, and to just have fun,” she said.

“Karen Bailey would say, find some person in the 60th row of the stadium and dance for them. It was about projection. There is a tendency for people who dance to watch your steps, to watch each other. Her intent was to have us project out into the stadium. Forget about yourself, forget about your steps...she wanted you to project.”

And how did everyone packed into Memorial Stadium react on game day? A smile spreads across Betsy's face.

"It's going to sound hokey, but the crowd went wild," she says. "We're standing there in our ending position, and it's like, wow. This is really something. We knew something special was going on."

□

When plans were revealed to celebrate the RedSteppers' 50th anniversary, Betsy didn't think twice about it. She would be there. She even worked with a trainer to prepare. While physically fit, she nonetheless wanted to be able to kick as high as possible. That entailed core-strengthening exercises with her trainer.

Six weeks before IU's homecoming weekend, she started receiving YouTube videos to help prepare for the dance routines.

On Friday, Oct. 7, Betsy, Mark and Susie headed down to Bloomington. She was one of about 165 RedStepper alumni — and one of 14 of the original 1972 crew — who arrived on campus.

Recalling the reunion, Betsy's voice trembles. She pauses. "I'm surprised I'm still so emotional," she admits. "But it was like you picked up where you left off, like time had never happened."

Rehearsals, led by Coach Wood, lasted from 4-5:30 p.m. RedSteppers were divided into three groups, categorized by the years they performed. Then came the homecoming parade. Friday night

also included a special banquet, one in which Cramer, himself, shared a humorous story from the early days of RedStepper history.

"As the band was walking around the track to prepare for the halftime entrance, I happened to be walking behind the band and most of the RedSteppers," Cramer told the group. "I looked up at the Ohio State sidelines, where the team was standing, and not a single player was watching what was happening on the field. They were all watching the RedSteppers."

Cramer's observation, as seen on a video posted online, drew huge swells of laughter from the RedSteppers. As the laughs subsided, he continued. "This 6 foot 7 tackle, he looked down at me, thinking I was the Ohio State band director, and he said, 'When are you guys going to get some of those?' I said, 'Those are ours, and you will never see them at yours.'"

Saturday, Oct. 8, saw the more than 200 RedSteppers — past and present — arrive at 6 a.m. on the football field. Mark estimates it was 34 degrees, Betsy possibly a few degrees warmer.

Then, the moment of truth. The game against the Michigan Wolverines. How did the halftime performance go, which included performing to Nancy Sinatra's "These Boots Are Made For Walkin'."

"Oh my God, that was so much fun," Betsy says. "The FOX camera guy did a great job. He ran the entire length of the field for the final number, which was over 200 women doing an end zone to end zone kickline."

Betsy laughs, saying there is a video recording of

the performance where you can hear someone in the background say, "Man, those old women can kick!"

For Mark and Susie, the kickline — the whole experience — moved them in ways they did not foresee.

"I got to discover what my wife did before I met her," Mark said. "Sue and I were kind of in the background, circulating around with cameras, staying out of the way. But watching them practice and watching them improve, watching the teamwork, they were supporting each other, and to see it coalesce into that...that just got to me."

Susie agreed.

"I was so overwhelmed by the team spirit," she said, "the history and the connection to the school. All those strong, capable women."

Susie shared a conversation that unfolded that weekend.

"One of the younger RedSteppers asked Betsy a very good question: what are you feeling right now? How are you processing this now?" Susie then turned to face her sister, smiling. "You said, you're basking in every moment. That young person said, 'I'm trying to transport myself out 25 years, and how I would feel at a 25th reunion. And you said, 'Why stop there?'"

Indeed, another RedSteppers reunion is planned in two years. Betsy will be there. She's also reconnected with fellow RedSteppers in Chesterton and

Hammond.

And the rush of that October celebration is still fresh in her thoughts.

"My moment started at 4 o'clock Friday and all the way to 2 o'clock Saturday," she said. "It was one huge adrenaline rush. I was on pure adrenaline. There was nothing that was going to stop me. I told Mark, when we go to this, I'm going to the parade, I'm dancing every number. I'm doing everything."

And she did.

In true, glorious, RedStepper fashion.

“Christmas at The Acorn” Returns for a Mix of Surprises and Old Favorites

“Christmas at The Acorn” is something the performers eagerly anticipate each year.

For Robert Swan, last year’s “Christmas at The Acorn” took on a rather bittersweet tone. He and his close-knit band of performers had endured trying times. Their guitarist passed away. Heart issues prevented tenor Warren Moulton from performing. Swan, himself, experienced health setbacks.

Then, of course, there was the reality of emerging from the COVID-19 pandemic.

All of that, ironically, cultivated a newfound appreciation of the annual Christmas concert.

“It was the most special show we’ve ever done,” Swan admits. “Everybody had been through this bleak time, with no live entertainment, and everybody felt super special about being together with other people.”

“In a way, it was almost like a religious experience. It was really tangible. Everyone there, and all the singers, were kind of bowled over by the specialness of the moment.”

This year marks the 19th year for “Christmas at The Acorn.” The concert is at 8 p.m. EST Friday, Dec. 23, at The Acorn, 107 Generations Drive, Three Oaks, Mich.

Joining Swan this year — he’ll, of course, offer his popular rendition of “Chestnuts Roasting on an Open fire” — are sopranos Emma Sorenson and Martha Cares, alto Kimberlyn Jones, tenor John Concepcion and baritone Michael Cavaliere.

Swan likes to balance the new with the beloved. This year offers a Shaker Christmas song “Star in the East,” the gospel piece “Sweet Little Jesus Boy” and the upbeat Spanish carol “Riu Riu Chiu.” Returning favorites include “Baby It’s Cold Outside,” “O Holy Night,” accompanied by harpist Ramona Kim, and “Santa Baby.” The musicians also include guitarist Marco Villareal. All the performers, Swan says, enjoy being together for this specific show.

“Here, you have a group of people, they all know each other and are finally together again,” he said. “Since they are working with other good people, it’s a refreshing communal experience for them. That happens every time we do this.”

“And now,” he continues, in light of the pandemic, “we’re moving on, continuing on and putting the past in the past. We’re just having a wonderful time. There is a freedom in that. That’s a cool feeling.”

Boys & Girls Clubs, Church Unite for New Programming

Boys & Girls Clubs of LaPorte County and LaPorte's State Street Community Church will unite next year to bring after-school youth programming to LaPorte's Brighton Street Green Space.

The church is a nonprofit operating programs and facilities that offer free community services, including the Pax Center, Pax Center Garden and Jackson Street Community Garden. Its newest addition, Brighton Street Green Space, features an education building and gardens in a park-like setting. 

Hallmark Christmas Movies Get a Hilarious Parody in “Campbells”

Justin Long and Brittany Snow play it straight, while mouthing often outrageous dialogue, in “Christmas With the Campbells.”

In “Christmas With the Campbells,” Hallmark Christmas movies get the spoof they deserve, but in a rather sneaky way. It’s deadpan to the extreme. No big sight gags, like a Mel Brooks picture, just hilariously raunchy dialogue.

To be fair, Hallmark holiday flicks are easy prey. Most gave up on new ideas years ago, now running on autopilot. The faces change, but the stories are carbon copies of each other. For a parody, you could go big with the gags, but “Christmas With the Campbells” creeps up on you. It looks and feels like a Hallmark movie, but contains the kind of talk you most decidedly do *not* hear in one. The result, streaming on AMC+ and through View on Demand, is not for all tastes, particularly if you offend easily. But if you get what the movie is trying to do, it’s laugh-out-loud funny.

The driving force here are longtime pals Vince Vaughn (“Wedding Crashers”) and Peter Billingsley (“A Christmas Story” and its new HBO Max sequel). What they’ve done is hire a veteran Hallmark director, Clare Niederpruem (“The Christmas Bow”), and co-writer Barbara Kymlicka (“You Light Up My Christmas”), to cobble together the essential ingredients. Then, Vaughn and “American Vandal” writer Dan Lagana raunch up the conversations to defy expectations.

The setup is classic Hallmark. “Pitch Perfect” alumna Brittany Snow stars as Jesse, who loves Christmas, particularly spending the holiday with the parents of her boyfriend Shawn (“Saturday Night Live” veteran Alex Moffat). A classic Hallmark jerk,

he breaks up with her right before Christmas. And, he does so with dialogue that flips political correctness the bird on so many levels, it can’t be published in a family newspaper.

To Jesse’s surprise, Shawn’s parents — sitcom greats Julia Duffy (“Newhart”) and George Wendt (“Cheers”) — still want her to visit at Christmas, despite the breakup. Shawn won’t be there — he has a big job interview — so to them, the time won’t be awkward.

Shawn’s parents live in one of those secluded hamlets that looks as if it was art-directed by Martha Stewart. The streets flawlessly decorated, not an ounce of trash on the ground. The one kink in the Hallmark template: Shawn’s parents may be sensitive to Jesse’s loneliness, but they waste no time sharing details of their healthy sex life.

And into Jesse’s life enters Shawn’s cousin, David. He’s played by Justin Long (“Dodgeball”), who clearly studied Hallmark actors closely. He delivers his every line with the booming command of someone narrating a documentary. And, he drops one cliché after another, although, again, the screenplay slips the unexpected into his conversations that sends the dialogue way off course.

Another complication is David’s long-ago girl-

friend (JoAnna Garcia Swisher), who owns the local bakery, still has the hots for him and speaks as if every baking term is a naughty innuendo. Toss in as well a cute dog, the holiday tradition of a Christmas tree where locals make wishes, and a bitter old lady who refers to every woman dating Shawn as trash.

Snow and Long play it straight, their performances never suggesting they realize they're in a comedy. That's what makes their dialogue so outrageously funny. Moffat, on the other hand, clearly relishes playing a self-absorbed pig, serving as the movie's anarchic symbol of off-color commentary.

At a mercilessly brief 87 minutes, "Christmas With the Campbells" knows not to wear out its welcome. A joke of a movie like this can only extend the joke so long before it fizzles. But the movie is over before you know it, and you've been laughing so hard for so long, the movie is a comedy gift. A naughty one, yes, but a gift nonetheless.

“Sr.” Explores Robert Downey Jr.’s Complex Relationship With His Father

“Sr.” was shot during the last two years of Robert Downey Sr.’s life, much of it during COVID-19.

In Netflix’s moving new documentary “Sr.,” Robert Downey Jr. embarks on a journey to reconcile feelings about his father, the counterculture director behind a rash of no-budget, underground movies. That road is filled with confusion, frustration and, ultimately, love, right as his father stands on the precipice of death from Parkinson’s disease.

It sounds gloomy, but it is not. There is a lot of joy to be found in this film that can be viewed as an exploration of fathers and sons, of filmmaking and facing one’s own mortality. And while Robert Downey Sr., who passed away in July 2021, remains a bit of an enigma, you come to admire his son all the more for emerging later in life as the survivor he truly is.

I must confess to not having seen any of Robert Downey Sr.’s films. Exceedingly low-budget, guerrilla-style satires like “Putney Swope,” “Chafed Elbows” and “Pound.” Absurdest movies that, today, likely wouldn’t survive because of the Puritanical spirit of cancel culture.

But in interviews during “Sr.,” as he’s often referred to, we see a man who lives and breathes film. Its aesthetics, its many approaches to spinning a story. Even when being asked questions, he’s always thinking of life behind the camera. How his discussions might be conveyed on screen through various stylistic choices.

We suspect, too, that filmmaking has been his first true love, and everyone else in his life a close second. That he realizes it now, facing his own mortality, is one of those puzzles in life where pivotal epiphanies arrive decades beyond when they should

have emerged.

But in Robert Downey Jr., we discover a man of great humor, who can look back on his own struggles, and his relationship with his father, with a sense of clarity. The movie, in fact, does not shy away from his own drug addictions, nor the fact that his father was the one who introduced him to drugs at a young age. An act that Sr. regrets to his dying day.

Whatever animosity Robert Downey Jr. may have felt toward his father, at any point in his life, seems long gone. More, he seems intent on documenting his father’s life: his films, his marriages, his impact on his children. And between father and son, we encounter two people who own up to their pasts, but refuse to let it define them. Instead, they adore each other.

After “Avengers: Endgame” (2019) killed off Tony Stark, I wondered what happened to Downey Jr. Was he taking a much-needed break? Turns out, he was heavily involved in commencing with “Sr.,” then faced with the challenge of continuing with it amid COVID-19. Zoom allows many of the conversations between the two men to proceed, and the physical distance between them does not dampen the honesty that emerges. In fact, the frankness takes on an urgency, with the effects from Parkinson’s disease

exacting a greater toll that confine Sr. to a bed.

"Sr." is not about erasing the past, but about accepting life for what it doles out. We live, we rise, we fall, we celebrate the special moments, our time on this planet comes to an end. And for Robert Downey Jr., there is peace.

This is one of the year's best movies.



Jennifer Chiaverini has an instinctive way of bringing history to life. With apparent ease, she breathes life into real people from the past while adding fictional characters who blend in so well, they seem just as real. Her extensive research is evident, and what makes historical fiction such a popular genre. Some of her other bestselling titles include: Mrs. Lincoln's Dressmaker, The Spy Mistress, Mrs. Lincoln's Rival, Switchboard Soldiers and Fates and Traitors.

"I heard the bells on Christmas Day / Their old familiar carols play / And wild and sweet / The words repeat / Of peace on earth, good-will to men!"

One of the most beloved poems turned into a Christmas carol...but how did it begin? In this seasonal story, Chiaverini has combined the great American poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, and the dark days of the American Civil War, with a present-day story of people fighting their own personal wars and uncertain futures.

Our story opens in the present at St. Margaret's Church in Boston. It is a catalyst for a group of people whose lives will come together in the most surprising ways. A Christmas miracle? Maybe.

The priest at the church is Father Ryan, who is assisted by Sister Winifred, who's been there since before Father Ryan was born. The church has a children's choir led by Sophia, with piano accompaniment by Lucas. They're in love, but can't seem to admit it to each other, let alone themselves!

Charlotte and Alex, two siblings in the choir, have a father who's MIA in Afghanistan. Camille, recent widow of a state senator, quietly sits in the back of the church listening to the choir sing.

Each of these people has a story told in the manner of *The Canterbury Tales*. The meshing of their stories will have a profound effect on each of them in this season of hope, so proudly and loudly proclaimed by the ringing of the Christmas bells.


In between these stories, we learn something of Longfellow. These chapters lead up to his writing the "Christmas Bells" poem. The music was added later. What you might not know is that Longfellow wrote that poem during Christmas 1863, while the nation was in the throes of a hateful civil war that threatened to divide us forever.

Going back to the summer of 1861, tragedy strikes the family when his beloved wife dies in a bizarre accident. Then, after war is declared, Henry's oldest son begs his father to sign papers so he can join the Union Army. Here he is, suffering from the loss of his wife and now, the possible loss of his son. He can't change his son's mind. Charley runs away and joins the army anyway, and Longfellow soon loses his desire to write...

Then, in 1863, Longfellow listens to the ringing


