Honoring the Brave

Back in 2010, when 73-vear-old Stan Adams began therapeutically writing down firsthand memories of his one-year Vietnam tour, he had no idea it would someday turn into a book, Mokane to Mole City: A Manchu Vietnam Memoir Bravo Co. Nov. 1968 - Nov. 1969.

"I must admit that next to serving and fighting in the War, reliving my tour and bearing my soul in the writing of this book has been the most difficult thing I have ever done," he writes in the book's foreword.

After several years of putting his thoughts, memories and, yes, fears down on paper, Adams knew he had a good start on what he had to do.

process," and that it was "difficult to write because sometimes the memories were too much and I had to step away

"My purpose in writing this book is to share my story and those of my close Manchu friends, not only for my daughters and grandsons, but as a way of honoring the men I served with as well as our fallen soldiers and their families who grieve for their loved ones," Adams wrote in the book.

The Manchus are members of the U.S. Army 25th Infantry "Tropic Lighting" Division, 4th Battalion, 9th Infantry Regiment. Continued on Page 2

The Beginning ...

The Mokane, Mo., native was drafted into service at 19 and left for an eight-week boot camp at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., in June 1968.

It was there he met Darrel Cavin from LaPorte, who was drafted at 20 after working close to a year at New York Blower Co. The two were sent to Fort Ord, Calif., for Advanced Individual Training to prepare for combat. There, they received additional training on weapons, grenades, small rockets, hand-to-hand combat, live-fire courses and emergency field medical procedures, as well as physical conditioning.

"We knew we were headed to Vietnam and, at the tender age of 19, we did our best to prepare for what was to come, although we truly had no idea of what that meant," Adams wrote in Chapter 3, "We Had No Choice."

Next, Adams and Cavin were sent to Advanced Weapons Training at Camp Roberts near Paso Robles, Calif. After a two-week leave of absence, when Adams admits he "was glad to be home with my family, but I had a lot of strange feelings during my visit, worrying that I would not return to them," the two arrived in Saigon on Nov. 26, 1968. Remarkably, assignments for the two friends who first met at Boot Camp mirrored each other during their tour as they ended up in the 3rd Platoon, Bravo Company. This was a rare occurrence.

"Once we met in basic training, we never left each other," Cavin said.

"He's a good friend to me. I'm sure he saved my life and I saved his," said Adams, referring to Cavin, who is now 75.

Adam's wife, Rita, shared a more lighthearted memory.

"Darrel would get a care package from home and Stan would have already gotten to it," she shared

"If it was good," Stan added, "it was gone."

(After mentioning his wife, daughters and grandsons in the dedication page of Mokane to Mole City, Adams includes the following: "And to my good friend, Darrel Cavin, thank you, I wouldn't have made it without you.")

Adams served as a bartender for Cavin when he married his wife, Barb Nowatzke, on July 1, 1972. Now Michigan City residents, the two celebrated their 50th anniversary at a special party July 9. Stan and Rita traveled from Millersburg, Mo., where they now live. A fellow comrade, 73-year-old Matt Switanowski, who lives in Warren, Mich., also

Switanowski was drafted into the Army at 20 from his hometown of Roseville, Mich. He served from August 1968-August 1970, spending a year in Vietnam from Jan. 3, 1969, to Jan. 4, 1970. His assignment lines up exactly as Adams' and Cavin's, except Switanowski was in a different platoon – the 1st instead of the 3rd.

Mokane to Mole City describes how when the young and naive Adams first landed in Vietnam, he was greeted with the smell of decomposing bodies and cart loads of body bags carrying fallen U.S. sol-

"There's nothing quite like it, and it leaves you with a noticeable scar in your psyche," he writes. "Later, I'd equate that horrific smell with physical fear and fear of the unknown."

It wasn't long before Adams and Cavin learned the unnerving fact that they were sent in as replacements for Bravo Company soldiers killed in the Thanksgiving Day Battle of 1968. All in all, there were 29 killed in action and more than 50 wounded in that battle.

Adams' and Cavin's first assignment was building "Mole City," a combat patrol base camp near the Cambodian border. Its purpose was to bait the North Vietnam Army and disrupt its supply lines through the region.

"After three days of non-stop digging bunkers and trenches, and filling and stacking 40,000+ sandbags, the base camp was finally complete," Adams wrote. "We were worn out. Ultimately, the camp was tiny – only 100-150 yards across in any direction. But in the heat, dust and humidity, to us it felt like we had dug the Grand Canyon. LTC Leo L. Wilson nicknamed the camp 'Mole City.' The name was fitting because for the most part, it was entirely underground and once it was finished, it seemed that we lived like moles in our maze of tunnels and bunkers. Mole City was the first base camp to be built this way."

Cavin shared his memories of building Mole City. "All we did at first for the first month was fill sand bags," he said." "I thought, 'Is this all we are here to do?' Then, I wished we had a few more (bags) when we got hit."

Adams explains in the book how the enemy was almost sure to attack because Mole City was positioned so close to them.

The Realities of War

And, attack they did during a Christmas truce, just before midnight on Dec. 22, 1968.

"The Manchus fought valiantly through the night as their ammo supplies dwindled, and, as a last resort, artillery was called in on Mole City," the back cover of Adams' book summarizes.

As helicopters brought in more ammunition, Adams and Cavin were carrying the weaponry to the bunkers while being shot at by the NVA, and while their own soldiers were shooting at an overtaken bunker. A mortar round hit 20-30 feet near them on Cavin's side. Later, it was determined he sustained

a hernia injury from retrieving the heavy ammunition off of the helicopters. He went to Japan for the operation and was gone two to three weeks.

Adams wrote in the chapter, "Daybreak – God Was With Us": "We later learned that our group of about 250 men had fought a hardened regiment of 1,500+ NVA soldiers that night...We had repulsed a human-wave attack by laying down a massive field of fire. So heavy was the volume of fire that four M60 machine guns barrels melted down completely ... It's nothing short of a miracle that only twenty American soldiers lost their lives as a result of this battle."

Adams was wounded only once throughout his military service, by enemy artillery during an attack in the thick jungle area of Tay Ninh. Shrapnel hit his right knee and left elbow, and he suffered burns on his stomach.

Adams, Cavin and Switanowski each received several medals for their Vietnam service. These included the Bronze star with a valor device, the Army commendation medal with a valor device and the Army Air Medal for flying more than 90 Eagle flights.

(Adams describes an Eagle flight as a "large air assault of helicopters to insert troops into hostile territory" in the "Index of Terms, Abbreviations & Acronyms" at the end of the book.)

Along with other Manchus, the three received numerous other medals, including Vietnam Campaign Medals, Vietnam Service Medals and Good Conduct medals.

Many years later, Adams learned Capt. Ron Cabral filed paperwork for him to receive a Purple Heart for the shrapnel injuries he received in battle. Sadly, he never did – even after filing two appeals and providing written substantiation by Cabral and seven other Manchus who were with him that day. Ironically, had he saved the bit of shrapnel that popped out of his knee years later while climbing an electrical pole, he could have used it as proof he was injured in the field in Vietnam.

During their tours of duty, Adams and Cavin both held the position of infantry rifleman. The two also were Radio Telephone Operators, with Cavin fulfilling this job for 11 months compared to Adams for three weeks. Ironically, Cavin serving as an RTO cost him a promotion from specialist 4 to sergeant since RTOs could not be sergeants. Adams, however, advanced to staff sergeant. Similarly, Switanowski held the positions of infantry rifleman and RTO, in addition to point man and squad leader. He also achieved the rank of sergeant.

The Healing Begins

The three veterans sat down to talk with *The Beacher* before the Cavins' anniversary party to discuss <u>Mokane to Mole City</u> and their tours in Vietnam.

However, speaking easily or openly about their experiences hasn't always been the case.

When Adams was formally discharged in June 1970, he returned home to find the reception shocking and unnerving. Because of the horrors he lived through, he could only sleep on his bedroom floor, where it now felt "normal" and "safer." The slightest noise woke him from a sound sleep.

"I often felt guilty for coming home and leaving my friends over there," Adams recalled in Chapter 45: "Trying to Move On." "It really bothered me not knowing if they made it back safely. I put my Vietnam pictures, medals and service awards in a suitcase in the back of the closet, hoping to put that entire experience away and out of my mind. Even without those physical reminders, no matter how hard I tried to forget, there wasn't a day that went by that I didn't think about what I had been through."

After his military discharge, Adams had a career in the electrical field, working at the Callaway Nuclear Plant near Fulton, Mo. He married Rita Russell on Nov. 28, 1974, and the two raised two daughters, Kimberly (Kim) Force and Nichole (Nikki) Tutt – who knew very little about what their father experienced in Vietnam. Stan and Rita now have two grandsons.

"It was just easier that way," Adams wrote. "Darrel and I kept in touch off and on over the years, but otherwise, I put it all behind me; buried it deep inside. Over the years I tried various ways to block

out the memories of what I had experienced over there, but nothing really worked. Many years later, I would be officially diagnosed with PTSD."

Darrel, who also was officially discharged in June 1970, and Barb raised four children: Charlene Mc-Guire, Sue Abrams, Dan Cavin and Cindy Cavin. They now are the proud grandparents of eight grandchildren. Retiring after 33 years as a semidriver, Cavin is "proud of never having an accident" after more than three decades on the road.

But, he, too, had difficulties adjusting to civilian

"I had a real hard time with it – just getting back - after what I had went through," he said.

After arriving back in the States and walking through the airport in his khakis (a less formal field uniform) with his mother, a man approached Cavin. Trying to spit on the Vietnam veteran, the man accidentally hit Cavin's mother instead.

"That was the worst thing he could have ever done," he said.

When he first tried to become a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars, Cavin said he was told, "You didn't fight a war."

But, "a bunch of us came back from 'Nam at the same time, and kept at it until we got in."

Starting as a carpenter, Switanowski worked for various military contractors before he retired with 33 years. He has two daughters: Corey Hostetter and Sarah Cole, in addition to two grandchildren.

"For 29 years, I never talked to anyone and lost contact with them," he said about his own Vietnam memories.

But in 1999, that changed for Switanowski when he was searching online and found information about a Manchu reunion.

"I said, 'I have to go. I have to make contact.' I was glad I went," he said. Continued on Page 6

The Adamses had attended two 25th Infantry reunions in hopes of locating Manchus. Then, Rita stumbled across the Manchu website, www.manchus.org. She focused on calling and emailing to try and get a large group of former Manchus to attend their first reunion in Orlando, Fla., in 2003.

Both Adams and Cavin made this first big step and attended their first Manchu Reunion — it was 35 years after they left for Vietnam.

At first, Adams admits he had mixed feelings about attending, but now "thoroughly enjoys them – they are great."

Cavin confessed he was reluctant to make the trip as well and would have backed out of it, except their children purchased the airline tickets for him and Barb.

While the Adamses waited to check into their hotel room, Stan heard an unmistakable Boston accent in front of him – it was Cabral, his commander who led the Bravo company.

"An outstanding leader and good man, Capt. Cabral was like a father to all of us, and I truly believe

that he was the reason so many of us made it home from that faraway place. He always looked out for his men and treated us with respect, even though he called us 'kids' at the time," Adams wrote in his book. "We often referred to him as 'The Old Man,' but it turns out the old man was only five years older than we were."

As the two old friends talked, Adams remembered Cabral's comment, "We need to write this down."

He would become one of Adams' top supporters of his book project.

"Although I had the support from my comrades, Capt. Cabral's encouragement motivated me to continue on my journey to finish the book," Adams explained. "He was a big influence...Capt. Cabral and I wanted to document about our unit because after we died, no one would know about it."

"Welcome Home...America's Tribute to Vietnam Veterans" was another important milestone for the veterans held June 13-19, 2005, in Branson, Mo. The event included demonstrations, displays, golf and fishing tournaments, even a homecoming parade. There was a "Dignity Memorial Experience,"

a replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall.

"Saturday's Grand Finale Celebration featured fifteen Vietnam-era aircraft – even a Huey Helicopter!," Adams wrote. "Darrel and I went up in it with our wives, but it was totally different than it was in Vietnam – we had to wear a seatbelt, couldn't sit on the edge of the chopper, and weren't getting shot at like we did over there."

Cavin said, "My kids had never heard about what I did in Vietnam" until the Welcome Home event. "We never got a welcome home until we went to Branson, Mo."

Changing The Future

Today, Cavin serves as commander of VFW Post 1130 in LaPorte. For the past six years, he has volunteered on the Veterans Treatment Court, where he helps local veterans with legal situations. He mentors and advocates for them, and accompanies them to court. He is actively trying to bring a VA Clinic to LaPorte. Now, veterans must drive to Crown Point, Mishawaka or Chicago, depending on which medical treatment they need.

Barb joined VFW Auxiliary in 1984. She served as president at the state level for 2004-2005, being in charge of more than 300,000 members. Her

special project was the audiology department at Riley Hospital for Children. They donated more than \$23,000 for hearing aids for children. For the past 19 years, she has served as secretary and treasurer of the local auxiliary.

"The reason I joined is that our men and women went there to fight," Barb said. "The least we can do if you're eligible to join is support them by working on the many programs to help the veterans."

She said the Cavin children, and even the grandchildren once they are 16, are members of the auxiliary.

"Our children grew up in the VFW so they are very respectful toward veterans and especially the flag," Barb said.

Both Stan and Darrel are open about seeing counseling professionals in the past and present through the VA hospital to help process what they lived through so many years ago.

"They help – they listen. But getting it out isn't easy," Adams admits.

In addition to the years he spent writing down his Continued on Page 8



thoughts, it took him three years to publish <u>Mokane to Mole City</u>. Honored to help bring her father's story to life, Kim, an attorney in Prairie Home, Mo., edited and published the book. To date, more than 1,100 copies have sold and many others gifted.

readers can obtain an autographed copy, as well as Amazon.


This past spring, Mokane to Mole City was made into an audio book for the blind or with vision or physical limitations after being approved and accepted by the Library of Congress Bureau of the Blind.

The Adamses have dedicated this version to Manchu Charlie Compa-

ny John Strnad from Nauvoo, Ill., who was blinded during the Mole City Battle.

They've also dedicated their time and resources to meeting with Manchu Gold Star families – immediate family members of a military service member who died in the line of duty – all across the country. It's not easy, but Adams knows the importance of being there to answer questions, to talk about what their loved one was like, to even tell them details of their last moments and, hopefully, offer closure.

"I often wondered, if I had been killed, would I only be a vague memory to my family?," Adams wrote in the last chapter, "Reflections." But now, af-

ter meeting and talking with the families of soldiers who died over there, I know that families never forget. They think often of their loved ones and never really get over losing them."

So many things – the sound of a Huey helicopter flying overhead, the smell of fish since the locals ate so much of it, sharp noises, the sounds of weapons being fired – bring back intense feelings of Vietnam in a flash.

"I look back on my time there and it was horrible, but I lived through it," Adams wrote. "The Manchu soldiers were young men forced to deal with situations that were many times unbearable, all the while we were still kids. I met a lot of brave and honorable men there who would've given their lives for me, and I for them. It's a thing with soldiers that we will never forget. I hope the life I have lived since then honors the ones we lost...My journey from 'Mokane to Mole City' seems a lifetime ago, yet remains in my heart and mind as if it were just yesterday. I grew up in Mokane, but became a man at Mole City."

Harbor Country Hikers will walk the trails of Chikaming Open Lands' Burns Prairie Preserve at 10 a.m. EDT Saturday, July 30.

The 1.5-mile hike is led by COL Executive Director Ryan Postema, who will give a brief introduction before leading the group through the preserve.

Burns Prairie is a restored mesic, or moist, prairie seeded with native grasses and wildflowers. Unrestored mesic prairies, once home to bison, are now rare in Michigan. None, in fact, occur on sites open to the public, according to the Michigan Natural Features Inventory.

Burns Prairie is especially notable for its wildflowers, including black-eyed Susans, butterfly bush, cone flowers and Queen Anne's lace.

Rated moderately physically difficult, the hike lasts about two hours. Participants should wear long pants (preferably tucked in), a sun hat, sturdy shoes or boots, and take insect repellent and water.

HCH membership is encouraged, but the public is welcome. The group observes federal and state COVID guidelines, and face masks are optional. An all-terrain rollator — a wheeled walker with oversized tires for unpaved areas — is available on a first-come, first-served basis by emailing harbor-countryhikers@gmail.com.





Five Tips for Taking Care of Your Trees

- 1. Don't prune ANY oaks from April 15th to September 30th. Oak wilt spreads readily during this time. Oak wilt will immediately kill any infected trees and will spread to your trees via root grafts if your neighbor prunes their oaks and they get infected. There is no treatment or cure for infected trees. Prevention is your Only choice.
- 2. Don't "spike" your trees. Spiking causes wounds that lead to infection and tree decline. Anyone who spikes trees is causing long-term damage to the trees.
- 3. Avoid damage to the roots. Large trucks cause soil compaction and digging up roots cause frayed wounds that can't heal and create access points for pathogens (fungi) that start root rot and weaken the trees structural stability. Lawn mowers can also cause damage to the root flares.
- 4. Keep a good amount of natural leaf litter and organic matter covering the roots under the canopy. Blowing leaves away from your trees can kill the fibrous roots by drying the exposed soil.
- 5. Consult an ISA Certified Arborist before doing anything to your tree.

"The Burning Sea" Reinvigorates the Disaster Movie by Andrew Tallackson

Sorry, Roland Emmerich, but Norway is kicking your butt in the disaster movie department.

Back in February, Emmerich saw his costly "Moonfall" crash and burn...and Hollywood was left scratching its head. This is a guy who, with "Independence Day," "Godzilla," "The Day After Tomorrow," "2012" and "Independence Day: Resurgence," clearly has a fetish, albeit a successful one, for ravaging the planet. But "Moonfall" was trash. Terrible acting, flimsy plot and special effects that, for a \$140 million movie, weren't that special.

"The Burning Sea," Norway's latest disaster epic from much of the team behind "The Wave" (2015), enjoyed a brief theatrical release and now is finding an audience through streaming and blu-ray. I've been singing the praises of "The Wave" since its debut. It was made for a fraction of the cost of an Emmerich picture...and it put most of them to shame. Once disaster strikes and a small Norwegian community has 10 minutes to reach safety, the movie is an anxiety-inducing adrenaline rush, told with a minimum of special effects and centered on a family whose scramble for survival brings them together.

"The Burning Sea" is Norway's answer to 2016's "Deepwater Horizon," with a splash of James Cameron's "The Abyss" (1989) tossed in for good measure. It is not as consistently enthralling as "The Wave," but when it revs up, it offers emotional, superbly executed action.

"The Wave" capitalized on actual concerns of potential flooding within Norwegian communities. "The Burning Sea" feeds off ecological fears spurned by more than 50 years of offshore drilling by the Norwegian government. Now, it's taken a toll. Cracks emerge on the ocean floor, causing a rig to collapse in a little over two minutes. Called to search for survivors — and it is here the movie echoes "The Abyss" — are two researchers, Sofia (Kristine Kujath Thorp) and Arthur (Rolf Kristian Larsen). They've been experimenting with a drone submersible. What they discover is that the ocean floor has been reduced, as one character says, to the equivalent of Swiss cheese by years of drilling. The swollen fissures mean the remaining oil rigs, and they number more than 300, are next to collapse.

It was here I braced for "the idiot plot." Not familiar with that term? It's simple. It means the screen-play requires characters behave like idiots, ignoring the warnings so the movie's special effects team can get to work, reducing all the sets to rubble. Remember "Dante's Peak" (1997), where Pierce Brosnan tries to warn a sleepy town its volcano is about

to develop fatal acid reflux? No one heeds the warnings, and the area is buried beneath layers of volcanic ash. This is what we do in American disaster movies. If we don't have characters who behave like morons, then we can't make everything go boom.

But by having a brain, "The Burning Sea" forces itself to up the ante. With government officials hoping to avoid another Deepwater Horizon fiasco, they commence with a large-scale evacuation of the North Sea's rigs. That sequence, which aims for ultra-realism, is one of the most exciting things I've seen in years, staged with a minimum of effects and exploiting our fears

of what is about to head their way. Then comes catastrophe, climaxed with a breathless last-minute escape and the image of a freighter literally getting swallowed up by the sea. The sequence is a triumph of acting, editing, music and carefully executed effects.

When Sofia realizes her boyfriend, Stian (Henrick Bjelland), is trapped on one of the collapsing rigs, she and Arthur hitch a ride with one of the rescue crews to see if they can save him. Up until this point, "The Burning Sea" has been touch and go in terms of pacing. It's building, yes, but with too many scenes of officials standing around looking worried. The downtime, however, has allowed Thorp, as Sofia, and Larsen, as Arthur, to create an extremely likable team, people who don't look like the athletic supermodels that populate Emmerich's pictures. They are smart, courageous, real people driven by a desire to save one of their own. And by this stage of the film, the tension, the action — it's all non-stop.

A prevailing criticism of "The Wave," its inferior sequel, "The Quake," and now "The Burning Sea" is that critics go gaga over them simply because



they're Norwegian. That they are the same tripe as their American inspirations. I would argue that when filmmakers, wherever they hail from, find a way to sidestep clichés, when they pump you up through smart storytelling, well, that is cause for celebration.


JROTC Cadets Attend National Drill Camp

"They are only sophomores, but they have stepped up to assume leadership positions in our program," he said in a press release. "With their positive attitudes, they really set the tone for other cadets to follow their leadership by example."


Both cadets had nothing but praise for the camp.


"It was great to talk to other cadets from all over the country to get their perspective as to how their programs are run," Wilson said



<u>Armored</u> by Mark Greaney (hardcover, \$28 retail in bookstores and online; also available as an eBook and an audiobook. 495 pages.)

There is no such thing as a boring Mark Greaney book. If it's about the military, private security bodyguards, international politics or the drug trade, Greaney is your author. He has traveled to more than 35 countries to train alongside military and law enforcement to lend credence to his stories.

The Gray Man has been his main character in most of these books. Now, he introduces Josh Duffey, an interesting, complicated man I hope appears in future books.

The story begins in Lebanon and ends up in Mexico, and the excitement starts at Page 1...

Josh is former Army, now working as a "high-threat security operator" for a number of companies that protect and defend politicians, the über rich and others. Call it what it is — trained and armed bodyguards. He's made a reputation for himself all over the world and is in constant demand.

On one occasion, Josh's outfit is in western Beirut to protect a politician about to make a speech in the middle of the city. It all goes south in a hurry when the motorcade is attacked and Josh finds himself alone with the politician's wife in a high-speed chase for their lives.

A high-powered rifle shatters Josh's left leg at the knee, and the lower leg has to be amputated.

Three years later, back home in

Virginia, the only job Josh can find is mall security. His wife runs a small cleaning business. They have two children, and the money just isn't there anymore.

At the mall one day, Josh is surprised when Mike Gordon shows up. He worked with Josh on many assignments and can't believe where his friend is now. He says he works for Armored Saint, a company with a not-so-good rep ("...those guys are psychos"), but with fantastic pay. He says the next job in Mexico will be worth \$30k and last three weeks. Josh wants in. It's not just getting back in the game that Josh is thinking about. It's mostly the big bucks that could get him out of debt.

He meets with Armored Saint and gets a job as TL — team leader. Question: why are all names in military and government acronyms? Drives me crazy. Anyway, Josh and Gordon are in the air and on their way to base camp to meet their teams. They are a bunch of smart-ass men with not-so-clean records, but most are ex-military and know how

to take orders, as well as shoot an Mk 48 machine gun. They all have nicknames: Josh doesn't know their real names and doesn't care. There will be 22 men in three teams providing security. Will that be enough?

Their job is to escort a UN delegation to meet with

a cartel in the Sierra Madre mountains, brokering a deal to bring some stability to the region. They are meeting with Archuleta, head of the Black Knights cartel, one of the largest. They also want the Black Knights to surrender some 60 recently purchased shoulder-launched missiles.

The delegation hopes to bring about some semblance of peace between the cartels. Really? Are they insane? The delegation's about to find out that cartels don't play nice with each other.

One woman on board is Dr. Gabriella Flores, a regional analyst at the Mexican National Museum of Anthropology. She knows many local dialects and customs. For some reason, Adnan Rodriquez, rep for the Mexican government, doesn't want her along and constantly belittles everything she says. What


does he have against her? Josh soon discovers her worth to the project, but it may be too late.

There's no time to find out as bullets soon start flying, and it's a rocky, dangerous trip to the meeting place. Other cartels don't want the UN in their territory and tell them so — with bullets and grenade launchers. But maybe Josh should look into his own group. Something feels off...

This is compulsive reading to the nth degree, with a startling realism that makes you want to hide under the couch: from the gun battles, to a harrowing trip on an airplane running out of fuel, to a wild escape on foot. When the bullets start flying, make no mistake, there is no holding back on the language or bloodbaths. Things don't always turn out as you would like; people you thought were trustworthy turn out to be the worst of the lot.

If you crave adventure with current themes, this is the book for you. I was glued to the pages with a Do Not Disturb sign in front of me.
