If you think chamber music is old-fashioned, stogy and meant for old folks, prepare to readjust your viewpoint and hold on to your seat belts.

Chamber music can be steeped in tradition, yes, but much of what will be presented at this year's Michigan City Chamber Music Festival is as fresh and brand new as today's sunrise. Many pieces have never been heard before, some performed on instruments just invented. So new is much of this music, brand new notation systems are being created to capture its rhythms, melodies and subtle harmonies on paper. "Many Peoples; Many Musics" is the theme for the 2023 Michigan City Chamber Music Festival. Artistic Director Nic Orbovich stresses "there are more composers in the world today than ever before," and that this year's theme "features the works from composers of traditionally underserved communities," all alongside the traditional masterworks expected at these amazing yearly concerts.

Twenty one years ago, Nic and his wife, Sunny Gardner-Orbovich, had a dream of sharing their love of classical music with Northwest Indiana and, more importantly, "bringing people together



through music." Nic took on the role of artistic director, selecting music to be performed at each concert. Sunny, using her background in education, became the festival's education director. Together with fellow musicians, they have created a popular yearly event that strives to look at music and composers in new and different ways.

"We like to break the invisible wall between audience and performer," Sunny says, as she focuses on telling stories through informal and interactive "Family Concerts." She strives to illustrate "how music has come through the human experience."

Consider this year's three family offerings.

The title of the Tuesday, Aug. 15, concert is "Hakenpalooza!" Rudolf Haken, who is professor of electric stings and viola at University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, will lead a group of his students in a concert the likes of which has never been heard in Michigan City...or anywhere else for that fact.

We should have known of Haken's penchant for creating new music and inventing new and unique instruments when he introduced his viola "pom-

posa" at the festival. It is an acoustic instrument that combines attributes of the violin and viola in one package. This year, he will demonstrate new electric instruments in ensemble performances of the music of video games, as well as traditional classics and new original pieces.

Haken takes these new forms of music seriously, insisting his students "study electronic instruments thoroughly." He speaks fondly of Nic and Sunny, and the day that, together, they dreamed of such a festival.

"Without the support of the people of Michigan City," he said, "such a concert series would not be possible."

Haken says the people of Michigan City are "so warm and encouraging; they are open to new ideas." In effect, people are saying, "So, you have new ideas? Whatever you have, bring it on!"



The second family concert, set for Thursday, Aug. 17, will be somewhat traditional, yet it will consider an old master from a new viewpoint. The program, "Baby Beethoven," will consider what Beethoven might have been like in his younger years. What would such genius have felt as he considered his growing deafness? The concert will feature music performed by festival musicians, shadow puppets, a deaf interpreter and interactive activities. This concert will consider Beethoven and his remarkable music from a new angle.

The Saturday, Aug. 19, family concert, "Come Together," will celebrate "Girl Power." Festival soprano Kim Jones is one of the artists. She also will be featured in the Aug. 18 celebration of African-American/European musicians. Jones has performed with the festival for the past five years. She says she is "so impressed at how Nic put these programs together. Each year, he puts together so much music of composers that I have never heard of. Nic is so special, he goes out of his way to be available to all of the musicians to address their questions and needs."

While much of the festival lineup will be new to performers and the audience, many times, a new composer can become a favorite. On Aug. 18, Jones will perform the works of Florence Price, who has become her favorite female composer.

Of the festival, Jones said, "We have so much support each year. I love to see the crowds. Each year, I

feel like I am coming home to Michigan City."

Baldwin and his wife, Melisa, who sings and teaches soprano voice lessons, have been part of the festival from the start, when Orbovich proposed it to fellow musicians at a music festival in Hot Springs, Ark., more than 20 years ago. They will present the world premiere of Paul Epstein's "You Give Me Beauty" at the Sunday, Aug. 20, concert.

Wesley and Melisa have four children ranging in ages from 23 to 5. Wesley says their children have "grown up in and around the Michigan City Chamber Music Festival." Wesley is always impressed by the "unusual level of enthusiasm shown by the people of Michigan City for this type of music." The community, he adds, takes "an unusual degree of

ownership" in the festival.

Wesley, Melisa and their family travel from Knoxville, Tenn., each year, where they both teach music, to participate in the festival. Over the years, Wesley says, "Michigan City has become very dear to us."

The festival is bolstered by a board of directors Continued on Page 4

#### Dunebrook's Dragon Boat Races Return to Stone Lake

After a three-year absence due to COVID-19, Dunebrook's Dragon Boat Family Festival returns to LaPorte's Stone Lake on Saturday, Sept. 9.

This marks the eight annual event. Teams can register at tinyurl.com/296pzy8b. Those interested

also can contact Dunebrook Development Director Cathy Laughlin at cathy@dunebrook. org. Sponsorship comes with benefits and promotions. Peer fundraisising is an added feature this year, with the top peer fundraiser recognized.

This year's event will be a festival atmosphere, according to Ted Perzanowski, director emeritus and event cochair, in a press release. That includes the GIS Family Fun Area, Food Truck Bazaar, the Captain's online auction, face painting by The Kraft Box and music. Co-Chair Tim Gartland returns to deliver play-by-play color commentary from the lifeguard stand.

Dr. Tammy Button, Dunebrook's executive director, encourages teams and spectators

to take sun canopies, beach chairs and blankets. Team shirts and themed team decorations are popular for the Spirit Award competition. Food will be sold, or individuals can take their own. Swimming is not allowed during the races.

Race participants must be a minimum of 13 years old, and every participant or guardian for minors must sign a waiver.



"We provide the dragon boats, safety vests, paddles, professional steersman and practice session with a dragon boat coach," Button said in a press release. "You bring 16-20 team members and a drummer. The skill in dragon boat racing is not in athleti-



cism, but in the synchronicity of the team working together. That is what makes it a great team-building event for businesses, faith groups, schools, families and friends, and organizations."

Reigning champions Applegate & Co. CPA's are returning along with Spirit Team winners Franciscan Health Michigan City. Both teams will compete with returning teams American Licorice, CLH, CPA's & Consultants, Northwest Health and newcomer Smooth Sailing Boat Detailing, and a team powered by Larry Zimmer and Perzanowski.

Button urges teams to register early to secure a spot. Every team races in three heats, with time to relax and hydrate between them.

Festival proceeds support Dunebrook's programs, namely Healthy Families, Body Safety, the Child Advocacy Center and Parent & Family Education.







The cadets will continue to support MCAS and



#### "The Beanie Bubble" Takes a Sharp Look at Male Ego Amid Notorious Craze

Of all the vices in "The Beanie Bubble" — greed, arrogance — the most fascinating case study is ego. Fragile male ego.

The new Apple TV+ film, which charts the disastrous collapse of the '90s Beanie Babies phenomenon, places founder Ty Warner under the knife, and what we encounter is a man who doesn't respect women. Three women, in particular, who experience the same infuriating treatment. Watching them triumph is what makes the movie so entertaining.

Husband-and-wife filmmakers Kristin Gore daughter of Al and Tipper — and Damian Kulash base their tale on Zac Bissonnette's 2015 <u>The Great</u> <u>Beanie Baby Bubble: Mass Delusion and the Dark</u> <u>Side of Cute</u>. On one level, it is time-capsule entertainment charting how the Internet emerged as a key marketing tool while people were losing their minds over these stuffed animals. In many cases, it was as investments, buyers turning to that fledgling online auction site, eBay, to make tidy profits off them.

Ty Warner, whose fascination with stuffed animals sparked the Beanie Babies craze, is played by Zack Galifianakis in a performance unlike anything he's done. The "Hangover" star typically plays the \* \* \* 1/2 "The Beanie Bubble" Running time: 110 minutes. Apple TV+. Rated R for language.

awkward loser pining to hang with the cool kids. Here, he plays Ty as pure manipulation: someone who uses his wounded image to attract smart women to amplify his vision. Then, when the money rolls in, he casts them aside, taking credit for their achievements.

The central women in "The Beanie Bubble," by the way, are based on three real people.

The first is Robbie ("Pitch Perfect" veteran Elizabeth Banks), who hooks up with Ty, has his aggressive business sense, but pushes for overseas markets before Ty is ready, ticking him off.

Next is Sheila ("Succession" star Sarah Snook), a divorced mother whose two girls become Ty's creative inspiration for new Beanie Babies.

The third, and most fascinating, is Maya (Geraldine Viswanathan), who joins the company right after high school. She's based on Lina Trivendi, who is credited as a pioneer in Internet sales.



Three dynamite actresses, each bringing their own intelligence to women whose business savvy enhances Ty's venture.

But here is where "The Beanie Bubble" becomes a compelling study of male ego. Ty, essentially, is a child. Threatened by women as business equals. Fragile ego that embraces new ideas when they contribute to his wealth, but not when they usurp his own prowess.

We know Robbie and Sheila will wise up. Banks and Snook are accustomed to playing women who don't back down from a fight. But again, the most fascinating is Viswanathan as Maya in an extremely sharp and likable performance. The actress creates the smartest person in the room. She breezes through work with a detached sense of snark, knowing when and where it's time to engage in "the game" with Ty. She can placate his ego, feed him the proper BS, to make him think her ideas are his.

But when Maya, privy to economic forecasts that suggest a Beanie Babies downfall is imminent, discusses the matter with Ty, again, we see a man who cannot respect a woman as his intellectual equal.

Were this a straightforward comedy, like "The First Wives Club," then Robbie, Sheila and Maya would embark on a covert mission to destroy Ty. Instead, we witness three women who value their own worth to walk away.

It's been quite a year for movies attacking corpo-

rate culture. Both "Air" and "Tetris," the later another Apple TV+ venture, explored how greed can bring out the best and worst in people. "The Beanie Bubble" falls more into the second realm, reflecting on toxic workplace culture within today's *#metoo* context. It may not have the same buzz as "Air," but it should. It works awfully hard to tell this story, and in doing so achieves the right balance of brains, humor and feminist triumph.

#### Exploring the Director's Cut of "That Thing You Do"

Chatting movies is my obsession. Even with people I've just met. On rare occasions, discussions turn heated, particularly if opinions clash.

What never fails, what triggers the same reaction every single time, is if I somehow bring up "That Thing You Do." The other person softens, tenderly, as if being asked to hold a puppy. The response: "I love that movie."

How could you not, right?

Feel-good movies have a way of producing the polar opposite reaction because they can get icky. Manipulative.

Not "That Thing You Do."

Everything about it feels right. And people hold onto it tightly, like a scrapbook of family keepsakes. What about it succeeds so beautifully? For some, it is the Oscar-nominated title song which, lucky for us, is catchy, because you hear it *a lot* during the movie. Others, myself included, stress the characters. For me, it introduced the offbeat loopiness of Steve Zahn. Tom Everett Scott's nice-guy drummer Guy Patterson, to me, was the epitome of cool. Women, my wife especially, quote Liv Tyler's wounded attack on lead singer Jimmy (Johnathon Schaech), *"I have wasted thousands and thousands of kisses on you.*"

You could go on about these characters for hours. If writer-director Tom Hanks, making his debut



behind the camera, is considered Hollywood's supreme everyman, then his characters imbue the same qualities. They are people you recognize. People who could be your best friend. The guy or gal in the band that plays at local hotspots.

"That Thing You Do" turns 30 in three years: *craziness*. Strange then, as much as my wife and I adore this movie, that we were unaware that in 2007, Hanks released a director's cut with nearly 40 minutes of additional footage. Now, director's cuts are nothing new. When movies, after their theatrical runs, arrive on streaming or home video, studios frequently toss five minutes or so of extra footage back into them, now marketed as the "director's cut." Most times, the additional scenes deserved to remain on the cutting room floor.

Forty minutes, though, is substantial. Forty minutes can significantly alter the tone or feel of a

movie. Had Hanks, with his director's cut, improved or bloated what to me was a perfect movie?

It was time to investigate. First, know that when "That Thing You Do" arrived in theaters in October 1996, it was not a hit. It was no flop by any means, grossing \$34.6 million against its \$26 million budget. But after a summer of box-office monsters like "Independence Day," "Twister" and "Mission: Impossible," Hanks' directorial debut was the type of little movie that required word of mouth to carry it.

That word of mouth didn't emerge until home viewing. Then, it took off. Big time.

The idea behind Hanks' film is the one-hit wonder. The band that achieves that one instant classic, yet falls to the wayside.

For Hanks, his film suggests that

raw talent, and being in the right place at the right time, can catapult a band into the big leagues, but only groups where everyone is on the same page achieve longevity.

It was a tribute to Hanks, to the sweet, gentle feel of his movie, that the Oneders, the Erie, Pa., band at the center of his tale, do collapse by the end, but you don't exit the theater bummed out. More, just thrilled to have shared the ride with these people. In fact, the moment when the band first hears its song on the radio remains a euphoric example of pure, unadulterated joy.

So what's in the director's cut, available through streaming services, blu-ray and DVD? Is it worth the time and effort? More yes than no. Future repeat viewings by my wife and me no doubt will choose the original cut that ended up in theaters. Having said that, Hanks' extended version is like spending time with old friends, learning more about their hopes, dreams and failures.

There is tons more, for instance, of Charlize Theron's Tina, Guy's girlfriend at the start of the film. You have to wonder what happened. Her presence in the film was significantly hacked down. The movie explores in greater detail the initial spark between her and Guy, then her bored rejection of him in favor of her dreamy dentist.

Ethan Embrey, as bass player T.B., not only gets more screen time, but what in the theatrical version was a youthful crush on a singer in a black girl group emerges as a full-blown love affair.

Guy Patterson's chance meeting with his jazz idol, Del Paxton (Bill Cobb), is expanded near the end to show Guy interviewing him for a local ra-



turns up in more scenes as astronaut Gus Grissom. There's even the implication that Hanks' character, Mr. White, is gay.

These character accents deepen the film. Round out the characters so they are more complex. My theory is that 20th Century Fox believed Hanks had a hit with his movie as long as he kept it light. That anything dealing with race, sexuality and Theron's unlikable ditz had to go.

In some respects, the studio was right. The bones of a more agreeable picture existed within the original framework of Hanks' vision. At the same time, the additional screen time grounds the story in a greater sense of reality.

The director's cut is essential viewing for anyone who adores "That Thing You Do." But if you're like my wife and me, where every once in a while, you get that "itch" to return to this world, the original theatrical cut will do just fine. Time has not dulled its charm. In fact, the innocence of it is more appealing than ever.



### **Teacher Project Grants**

Sept. 10 is the deadline for Michigan City area educators to apply for Unity Foundation of LaPorte County grants impact teaching and learning.

Unity Foundation manages three programs, established by donors, that have invested in more than 1,000 educators here since the mid-1990s. The grants are \$400-\$500 each. Teachers can complete a brief application at tinyurl.com/23ue3mt9 for 2023-2024 academic year projects.

The Michigan City Education Foundation makes grants of up to \$500 for teachers at public and parochial K-8 schools. Teachers may use grants for hands-on or virtual activities in any academic area or life skills.

(In 1994, the Michigan City Chamber of Commerce, Mary Lou Linnen and Bud and June Ruby founded MCEF to empower educators.)

The Barbara A. Carmen Memorial Endowment Fund honors the memory of the former Michigan City kindergarten and first-grade teacher in public and parochial schools. It makes grants of up to \$400 for items that enrich curriculum or enhance a teacher's ability to meet student needs.

Both programs accept proposals from educators at: Barker Middle School, Coolspring Elementary, Edgewood Elementary, Joy Elementary, Knapp Elementary, Krueger Middle School, Lake Hills STEM Magnet Elementary, Marsh Elementary, Notre Dame Catholic School, Pine Fine Arts Magnet Elementary, Queen of All Saints Catholic School, Springfield Elementary and St. Stanislaus Kostka Catholic School.

The Teacher Innovation Fund is a small grant program for Michigan City High School and LaPorte County Career and Technical Education/A.K. Smith Career Center teachers and professionals. MCAS Superintendent Dr. Barbara Eason-Watkins and former Michigan City Mayor Chuck Oberlie provided the idea and seed money from personal funds. Grants can be used to buy equipment, supplies, tools for special programs or for ideas to enrich curriculum and meet student needs. Each grant applicant may request up to \$400.



Night Will Find You by Julia Heaberlin (hardcover, \$27.99 retail in bookstores and online; also available as an eBook and an audiobook. 352 pages.)

Astrophysicist or psychic? Or both? Is that even possible?

That's the question this week as Heaberlin brings a powerhouse story of identity, family secrets and kidnapping — could be murder.

Vivian Bouchet is a 28-year-old astrophysicist. She's received her doctorate and is working on the possibility of extraterrestrial life in deep space at a desert research center. Her mother claimed to possess psychic abilities, but it is Vivvy who might really have it. Vivvy doesn't have a crystal ball. She

has inner instincts where touching a photo or object, like a bracelet, is a voice whispering in her head.

Vivvy's mother had a number of different jobs over the years, but the strangest was photographer for the county morgue. She kept an album of her photos, which Vivvy studied when no one was around. In Fort Worth, Texas, her mom set up a phone line for psychic readings, telling Vivvy she has the same abilities, but Vivvy is not convinced.

When she is 8, she meets Mike Romano, a 14-year-old whom she has a strong premonition will get killed by a blue horse. When she tells Mike, his mother makes him stay away from her — after all, the child must have psychological problems — until one day, he defies his mother and walks by her house. A teenager in a blue

Mustang jumps the curb. If Vivvy had not pushed him out of the way, he would have been struck.

Luck? Or intuition? Or something else?

It's now 18 years later, and Mike is a policeman married to Vivvy's younger sister. He's working on a cold-case kidnapping and possible murder when he calls on Vivvy for help. The case goes back 10 years when 3-year-old Lizzy Solomon disappeared from home and her mother, Nicolette, was charged with her murder. No body was found, but the woman is serving a life sentence.

Mike begs Vivvy to look over a number of files on missing persons, including Lizzy's, to see if she can read anything into them. Going through the files, she gleans a little information from a few of them, and no information at all from others. But with this case, Vivvy is struck by the feeling that Lizzy is still alive, marking the file "alive" to Mike's surprise.

Mike brings along another cop, Jesse Sharp, who sees Vivvy as a fake looking for publicity.

There are a number of photos in the Solomon case file. One, in particular, shows a forest scene with, among other things, a child's bracelet on the

ground. Vivvy feels a link to Sharp from that photo, but can't understand why he put it there — unless he is testing her abilities. Vivvy does feel the photo must mean something to Sharp. Maybe he is hiding a few secrets of his own?

Despite him belittling her, she can't help but feel an attraction to him for some reason even she doesn't understand. After all, he's gruff, dismis-

> sive and obviously playing the bad cop. And it's also a little off-putting when she sees him following her all over town. Creepy. She can't figure out if he is "on the side of the angels or cuts their wings and lets them fall."

> Then, a podcaster, Bubba Guns, who deals in conspiracy theories and reminds me of an Alex Jonestype character, starts talking about Vivvy and making fun of her psychic abilities. He even invites her on his show. She agrees in order to tell her side, and their back-andforth conversation is exciting and engaging. Vivvy can't help but notice that Bubba seems to know more about the Solomon case than he will admit, but the show turns out to be a huge mistake for Vivvy, because Bubba's followers soon are camped

out in her front yard, threatening her. Looks like her gift is turning out to be more of a curse.


Yet, Vivvy can't get Lizzy Solomon out of her head, and despite the crazies after her, she continues what is no less than a quest, because she is sure the girl is still alive. After meeting her mother in prison, she is convinced she is not a murderer.

Every chapter will have you vacillating between scientific skepticism and faith in the unseen. The psychic world vs. the scientific world embodies a great plot filled with characters who keep you wondering if you like them or not. And there are plenty of twists and things you don't see coming — like the climax. Not what I expected.

The final word: As Vivvy says "My whole life, I've struggled with my belief in science versus this thing my mother called a gift. But I don't always accept the truth — that these two forces inside my head thrive on each other.

"We are given imagination to expand our worlds, and science to confirm it. They are not mutually exclusive." What do you think?
