hirteen middle-schoolers have South Shore Sailing School to thank for unforgettable summer memories. Launched several decades ago, the

Launched several decades ago, the school immerses students in the recreational sport, passing on a love of sailing on Lake Michigan. For two weeks in June, the 13 Michigan City Area Schools students participated in three-hour morning sessions that included classroom instruction and hands-on experience.

This year, there was a concentrated effort to get more MCAS students involved in this unique opportunity in their own backyard, so to speak. It emerged from a conversation South Shore Sailing School board member Dale Moyer had with MCAS Superintendent Dr. Barbara Eason-Watkins.

Moyer said the realization was, "Local kids may

not have had the access to a program like this as we would have liked."

So, students at Barker and Krueger middle schools were targeted with the help of principals Lucas Snyder and Joshua Malone, respectively.

Unity Foundation of LaPorte County also was instrumental in making this happen.

"The Unity Foundation has known about the sailing school for some time and was looking for an opportunity to support more local students to be involved, as it's a terrific learning experience that you can't get just anywhere," Unity President Maggi Spartz said. "...We were delighted when MCAS Superintendent Barbara Eason-Watkins mentioned a possible connection to our middle schools. Never before had we had a number of our local students in the sailing school. Usually, it was because they

didn't know about it, couldn't afford the fees or find transportation to and from the harbor. Everyone came together, and we were able to have our first class of MCAS students participate!"

Unity donors, she added, helped by funding extra equipment and supplies.

The session the middle-schoolers participated in was one of four — with morning and afternoon classes offered — held in consecutive weeks for students ages 8-17. An additional 16 students, not part of the MCAS group, enrolled in the afternoon session from June 12-23. The average classroom size is 25; morning sessions run from 9 a.m.-noon and afternoon sessions from 1-4 p.m.


Moyer said students who sign up for the program are mostly from the region, including Chesterton and Valparaiso, but others sign up from Indianapolis and across the nation, even some international students. Sometimes, kids are part of families vacationing in the area. The program costs \$475 and the demand is high, with open slots filling up quickly each spring. There are needs-based scholarships available; those interested should visit www.southshoresailingschool.org by February of each year.



Taylor Wilkins, a Michigan City High School freshman, said she would definitely recommend the program to other students.

"For me, I came into camp not expecting it to be as fun as it was," she said. "My mom had signed me up without asking me, but I was pleasantly surprised with the experience. The counselors were fun and knowledgeable. I learned that sailing can be fun, and also challenging."

Her mom, Tracy Wilkins, jumped at the chance after learning about the opportunity, which she called "an experience of a lifetime," through MCAS. "I feel it taught her that sailing is fun and can be done in all sizes of boats," she said. "Also, Taylor has never sailed before, but loves all water sports, and this gave her the chance to learn the basics of sailing in a safe and local environment. I would highly recommend it. It's a way for kids to learn what it takes to be a sailor."

It's not uncommon for the school to instill a love of sailing.

"There's nearly a 100 percent ratio of generating interest and passion about the sport," Moyer said.

Typically, a daily lesson begins with about 20-30

minutes of "Chalk Talk" classroom instruction in an outdoor pavilion. There, instructors talk them through the sailing process, describing it before the students actually get on the water, Moyer said.

Students learn the fundamentals of sailing, such as the kinetics of what makes a boat go through the water, right-of-way, safety, points of sail and capsizing, South Shore Sailing School President Scott Kingan said in a "Friends & Neighbors" Lakeshore PBS video (Episode 407, Season 4, Episode 7) that aired July 27, 2022.

The rest of session time is devoted next to or in the water for more active learning.

"By Week Two, they should be able to sail a boat on their own," Kingan said. "In Week Two, we actually put the kids in the boat by themselves."

Other fundamentals Moyer says the students learn include different parts of a boat and how to rig one, in addition to the physicals and mechanics of sailing. While a fun sporting activity, he said, it fits in well with STEM learning.

"Angles, science, buoyancy, boats and motion... they learn about it without even knowing they are," he said.

And, there's much more students are gaining.

"It instills in them confidence – the ability to manage situations. Every day is different," Moyer said. "They gain an appreciation for nature and outdoors...a safe way to have fun. They learn responsibility in managing a boat and safety for themselves, others and the boat itself."

Safety is paramount at the sailing school. Kids go out on compact RS Zests boats described by Moyer as "nice learner boats." There's a seating area for two to three.

"All of our instructors and kids wear life jackets all

the time," Moyer assured. "We are very focused on safety. There are inflatable rescue boats always ready. And we monitor the weather and wind carefully."

Furthermore, he said, instruction is given in the channel, which leads to the mouth of the harbor, and in an area of the lake protected because of the breakwall. Also, this is the area within the breakwall bounded by the walkway that leads to the lighthouse, where you often see people fishing or taking in the sights.

During the sessions, there is a scheduled "Big Boat Day," where owners of three to seven large boats volunteer on the final day of classes.

"Kids get to tour them and see how what they learned translates to a larger boat," Moyer said.

A larger boat, a 26-foot-long Catalina, recently was donated to the sailing school. Lessons will expand to this next summer. It's better to begin on a smaller boat, Moyer said, then transfer those skills to a larger boat.

At the end of every session, there's a cookout and a small ceremony where completion certificates are distributed with special personality traits such as leadership and good sense of humor.

"We have an evenly distributed gender population. That's a positive thing," Moyer said, adding there are several female instructors. Exceptional students are hired the next summer to be certified instructors-in-training (CITs).

"We grow our own here, in a sense," Moyer said. His 19-year-old son, Nathan, is head instructor. Starting the program at age 8, he has been involved every summer, progressing from a student, to a CIT, to an instructor, to his current title. His 23-year-old daughter, Madison Moyer, also completed the program and became an instructor.

Dale Moyer has been involved with boats all his life. At 19, he started sailing through the Chicago Parks District, later racing on a large boat from Burnham Harbor. He's been a small boat sailor on a Hobie 16 Catamaran.

The sailing school also offers adult sessions from 5-7:30 p.m. Thursdays for four weeks. The cost is \$375, and it's equally appropriate for those wanting to sharpen their sailing skills or those beginning their journey.

"It's a great entry point for those who know nothing about sailing," Moyer said. "Adults are often the parents of students; they want to learn and have fun, too."

Moyer is one of seven board members, who meet monthly. In 2018, the Michigan-City based group became a 501©(3) under the name South Shore Nautical Education Foundation Inc. (SSNEF).

Spartz was part of the group that made that happen.

"My sister, Suzy, who also did the program, and I were a sailing team," she said. "I still race sailboats. My sister moved back from Phoenix and does local races with me on a 36' boat called Mrs. Jones."

On July 22, Spartz raced to Mackinac for the  $28 \mathrm{th}$  time.

"So, yes, I'm passionate about getting young people exposed to sailing, itself, water safety, problem solving, self-control and leadership that sailing requires," she emphasized.

Partners that support the sailing school include Michigan City Port Authority, Michigan City Yacht Club and Michigan City Cruiser Class.

"We couldn't do this alone," Moyer said "We have good relationships with our partners."

His thoughts on the future of what he considers a "real gem" in the community?

"We want to keep going with what's working well," he said. "We want them to have fun, enjoy the summer and build memories."



#### "The Moving Image Plays Itself"

A free, all-ages Browning Cinema screening of "The Moving Image Plays Itself" is at 7 p.m. EDT Thursday, Sept. 7, at The University of Notre Dame's DeBartolo Performing Arts Center.

Borrowing inspiration from Thom Anderson's 2003 film, "Los Angeles Plays Itself," the program draws from 25 16mm films within Indiana University-Bloomington's collections, which highlight the filmmaking process, film-handling equipment, exhibition and the cellulose material, itself, putting the medium at the forefront. Part film history, part educational-experimental effort, sampled films include "How to Make a Movie Without a Camera" (1971), "The Growing of a Young Filmmaker" (1968), "Sherlock Jr." (1924), "Let's Go to the Movies" (1949) and "Basic Camera Technique" (1948).

The program is one of three that make up "An Archival Roadshow," which has been curated, edited and produced by Jon and Jennifer Vickers, who opened Vickers Theatre, Three Oaks, Mich., in the mid-1990s. Jon went on to open The Browning Cinema in 2004 and the Indiana University Cinema in 2011. The two will provide an introduction, followed by a brief Q&A. 

#### **Learning to Adore I-94**

I wasn't the best tuna, but at least I didn't end up in a can. But, as I sat there in the creeping crawl of the eastbound migration, I expected that I'd be canned in my Honda Civic any second.

It never happened, but the psychic scars were



blazoned on my imagination. In a real sense, I developed PTSD from driving I-94 between Chesterton and Chicago.

So I began to avoid it at all costs, even going so far as to take U.S. 20 all the way into Chicago. Or perhaps a bit of the Indiana Toll Road, then taking side streets to my various destinations in the city of my birth.

I even subjected friends to my alternate routes. They were not amused.

One of them, Jon Wheeler, said he had a wonderful solution to our periodic trips to the city for spiritual edification.

Jon, who lives in South Bend, suggested we meet at the Indiana Dunes National Park Visitors Center parking lot in Chesterton on the Sunday mornings in question. We could carpool from there, with Jon at the wheel of his Prius, me comfortably settled in the passenger seat. Jon, you see, is from the East Coast, so he is accustomed to heavy traffic. No worries, he handles it with ease. Plus, he said I might be able to overcome my fear and loathing of the interstate in question and actually come to adore it. Well, at least face my fears and get my mind around actually driving I-94 again.

I agreed. We gave it a go on a recent Sunday morning.

I distracted myself by taking pictures with my Canon digital camera, and I calmed down. Really, really calmed down.

Signs for sure that all would be well.


And all was well as Jon motored us steadily into Chicago on I-94.

So, let the record show that Yours Truly is going to pilot his 2013 Honda Civic next time out. Face everything and recover, right? Isn't that what "FEAR" stands for? Face Everything And Recover? I believe it does, and I believe I am a long way on the road to recovery. I don't yet adore 94, but someday, I might even see three great egrets as I'm tootling along in bumper-to-bumper traffic on you know what highway.



#### "Blue Beetle" Has More to Offer Than Just Another Origin Tale

A more intriguing superhero tale exists beneath the surface of "Blue Beetle," and when it emerges, what's on screen is the better movie.

DC's latest effort to encroach on Marvel turf is another origin story where another unsuspecting nice guy develops extraordinary powers. And like most DC efforts, when it's through with the backstory and the "plot" kicks in, everything lurches toward another overblown effects finale.

That the title hero is Mexican American isn't just woke lip service, though. There is a lot more going on that speaks to the immigrant experience in America, and within the Latino community the importance of family.

Director Ángel Manuel Soto and writer Gareth Dunnet-Alcocer can't entirely avoid obvious comparisons between their hero, Jaime Reyes, and Peter Parker in Marvel's "Spider-Man" franchise. Jaime is a sweet, easygoing guy fresh out of college who, in trying to help out his family, is transformed by an ancient scarab into his alter-ego, Blue Beetle.

But the movie's stroke of genius is in casting "Cobra Kai" star Xolo Maridueña as Jaime. You couldn't ask for a better actor. This guy instantly projects likability with a smile or kind gesture. There's nev-

er any false note from him. You believe he's capable of goodness and greatness.

It helps, too, that the movie gives Jamie a wonderfully eccentric family, one that sticks together at all costs. Like his supportive parents (Elpida Carillo and Damián Alcázar) and feisty, mischievous grandmother ("Babel" Oscar-nominee Adriana Barraza). I particularly appreciated Belissa Escobedo as his younger sister Milagro, who is as mouthy, pushy and devoted as any sibling could be.

Comic relief exits in Jamie's uncle, Rudy (George Lopez), but it is the veteran comedian who has the film's most telling line when encouraging his nephew by saying, "Maybe it's time we get our own hero."

And by "we," he means Mexican Americans. That is the greatest strength of "Blue Beetle." It's not just about representation. It is, as Milagro notes about white society, "We're invisible to people like

that, Jamie. It's like our super power."

So when Susan Sarandon's heavy, Victoria Kord, scrambles to strip Jamie of his newfound power, she behaves like an imperialist hiding behind democracy and capitalism. It is no coincidence, then, that the attack on Jamie's home. his family hiding within, is staged by Soto as the equivalent of an immigration raid. Oppressive, demoralizing... and within the cover of night. And it is that experience that triggers something in Jamie's grandmother to not let the past repeat itself. To take charge.

You really care for Jaime and his family. And with the relatively subdued Sarandon

creating a villain who isn't concerned with ruling the world, just profiting from it, the message is that Jamie and his family deserve a piece of the pie like everyone else.


Again, "Blue Beetle" is not perfect. Too many special effects at the end. But for DC, after a creaky

stretch of movies — the so-so "Black Adam," the unfairly maligned "Shazam: Fury of the Gods," the regrettable "Flash" misfire — "Blue Beetle" is a step forward. Proof all is not lost for DC.

#### "Wham!" Documentary Takes Insightful Look at Pop Duo

The Netflix documentary dispels all myths that the end of Wham! arose from George Michael's rising popularity.

Back in 1986, when Wham! called it quits, we just assumed that because George Michael's star wattage had eclipsed Andrew Ridgeley's, he'd kicked Ridgeley to the curb to launch a solo career.

Wrong.

That may be the biggest revelation of "Wham!," the Netflix documentary that arrives on the 40th anniversary of the duo's debut album "Fantastic." The emphasis is the resilient bond between Michael and Ridgeley: pals since childhood, friends beyond the duo's wild three-year run.

The documentary's approach is nothing new. It's entirely archival footage spliced together with audio interviews of Ridgeley and Michael, who died of heart disease in 2016. But it is the insight into these guys that forces us to re-evaluate the duo's demise after achieving global success.

This also may be the most honest look at the disconnect between pop persona and private identity, a subterfuge that, for Michael, was the deciding factor in him leaving Wham! for a solo career.

Imagine, too, my ignorance at not realizing that Michael was Greek and Ridgeley Egyptian. That Freddie Mercury's family hailed from western In-



dia was lost on me as well until 2018's "Bohemian Rhapsody." Then again, the entertainment industry is notorious for downplaying any ethnicity of its cash cows for fear of deterring mainstream audiences.

Michael's private troubles, though, ran deeper. He knew he was gay and at 18 outed himself to Ridgeley, who had no issue with it. They'd been friends since Ridgeley was 12 and Michael 11. Considering Michael's stage presence, the irony is that Ridgeley was the more outgoing, Michael the shy loner.


What the documentary reveals is that Michael feverishly worked to craft a bubbly pop personality, and to go public with his sexuality would jeopardize the duo's meteoric rise. So, he kept himself in check, sinking into depression behind the scenes for not being true to himself.

Public perception at the time was that Michael was the driving creative force behind the duo. There is some truth to that, but director Chris Smith stresses the collaborative nature between Michael and Ridgeley. At the same time, it conveys Michael's yearning to be taken seriously as a songwriter, not the latest perpetrator of bubble gum pop.

What's moving about the documentary is how, at the height of Wham!'s fame, Ridgeley respected Michael's desire to be creatively true to himself, and to his own sexuality, subsequently agreeing to walk away from their shared success. And, he continued to support Michael as his solo career catapulted into the stratosphere.

You know, it's funny. I wasn't a huge Wham! fan

back in the '80s. Sure, I knew all the songs. Who wasn't listening to them? But hearing all those hits again, from "Careless Whisper," to "Freedom," to "Wake Me Up Before You Go-Go," I found myself smiling. Filled with nostalgia and more appreciative that these guys were just having fun, trying to put out music that made people happy.

There is more to this story, obviously, in terms of Michael, how his career evolved and his run-ins with the law. But the movie is titled "Wham!" for a reason. It aims to chart that specific moment in time for Michael and Ridgeley, and it does so splendidly.

One day, someone needs to tally how many movies Quentin Tarantino influenced.

The irony, of course, is that the Oscar winner is a big copycat, himself. Toiling at a video store before striking gold with 1992's "Reservoir Dogs," he developed a voracious appetite for pulpy grindhouse fare. One man's cinematic trash was solid gold treasure to him. Somehow, through osmosis, he absorbed everything he observed to create his own revisionist, hyper violent universe.

When the Finnish import "Sisu" dropped in theaters this past spring, I dodged it. There are some topics that, when applied to popcorn fare, make me itch. Nervously. Specifically slavery and the Holocaust. The original "Scary Movie" (2000), for instance, mined Spielberg's slave ship courtroom drama "Amistad" (1997) for laughs with a fake movie trailer that still makes me cringe. Hitler's fate in Tarantino's "Inglourious Basterds" (2009) was pure revenge fantasy.

But with the two-season arc of Amazon Prime's "Hunters," my ironclad reasoning softened a bit. Maybe, I wondered, revisionist history is not entirely a bad thing. Maybe, we *can* achieve a catharsis to tragedy with what *might have been*.

Running time: 91 minutes. On Demand. Rated R for strong bloody violence, gore and language.

With "Sisu" consistently hovering among the Top 10 most-streamed movies, it was time to give it a chance. My reaction: It's insane, illogical, outrageous...and outrageously entertaining. Not for the faint of heart, that's for sure. Writer-director Jalmari Helander has said his movie was inspired by "First Blood" (1982), the debut of Stallone's Rambo, and real-life Finnish military sniper Simo Häyhä. That may be true...but the movie is pure Tarantino.

The story is lean to the extreme: one man's practically supernatural ability to turn the tables on his Nazi pursuers.

Set in late 1944 during the Lapland War, we meet former commando turned gold prospector Aatami Korpi (Jorma Tommila), who lives on his own with his horse and dog, preferring the wilderness to the encroaching reality of war. We see that in a spectacular image of Aatami, seated with his dog, as Nazi fighter planes soar through the sky above.

And in a short matter of time, Nazi soldiers march across the land, prepared to conquer, yet ill-prepared for the foe they will encounter in Aatami.

In all his films, but especially the "Kill Bill" pictures, Tarantino pushed his violence to such outlandish extremes that, after the initial shock, it stopped being offensive, existing more as comedic carnage. Aatami, a one-man army if there ever was one, uses everything within his grasp to thwart his attackers. As the limbs fly and blood sprays, you find yourself laughing not just at the excess of it, but that Helander is using comedic shock value to undermine the Nazi presence. Our laughter in response to their demise, and Aatami's crazed ingenuity, is

in its own way a cathartic release. That evil can be kept at bay, even by one man.

Aatami, by the way, does not speak amid 99 percent of the picture. That duty falls to the Nazis, their dialogue released in short bursts. Helander also introduces a group of women — prisoners of the Nazi group following Aatami — who get the most satisfying, laugh-out-loud retaliation you could want. And it is one of those women (Finnish actress Mimosa Helena Willamo) who gets the movie's pulpiest dialogue: It's not that Aatami cannot be killed, but that he simply refuses to die.

With that type of dialogue, you know what you're getting with "Sisu." There is nothing subtle or brainy about it. And, it's over before you know it,

so it is only afterward that you have time to dissect whether it's guilty pleasure time or garbage.

I'm leaning toward Door No. 1.







The Librarianist by Patrick deWitt (hardcover \$30 retail in bookstores and online; also available as an eBook and an audiobook. 342 pages.)

If this book was a movie, it would be shot in black and white. It is a quiet story. No guns blazing, no rocket's red glare, just a man who could be anyone's neighbor. A neighbor you probably don't notice much because he comes and goes silently to the library job he loves completely. He not only works as a librarian, but he lives as one — making him a librarianist — at the pinnacle of the profession.

"Bob had long given up on the notion of knowing anyone, or of being known. He communicated with the world partly by walking through it, but mainly by reading about it."

And yet, there's so much about Bob Comet that is interesting. For example, his name, Comet, must bring a smile to your lips as you realize this man is no shiny object racing through life like a celestial object. If anything, he loves his anonymity, and his ability to observe while not being observed.

The year is 2005 and Bob is 71 and retired from the Portland, Ore., public library system. He lives in "a mint-colored house" his mother left him, and his days are pretty dull, it being winter and all, until he decides to go to the nearby convenience store, where he observes an elderly lady in a pink sweatsuit standing in front of the cool-

er, just staring. It's discovered she has a tag with her name and the name of a local senior center. Bob says he will escort her back home. Chip — that's her name — wears a large pair of sunglasses and doesn't speak, but she intrigues Bob nevertheless.

At the Gambell-Reed Senior Center, Bob meets Maria, the center's overworked and underpaid manager. She thanks Bob for bringing Chip back. Seems Chip's one of the few people who actually lives there. Most of the folks come by bus in the morning and just spend the day.

He makes a snap decision and asks Maria if he can help out. Doing what, she asks? Why, reading to the elderly, of course. She agrees, and he makes the obviously very bad, yet funny in its own way decision to read Edgar Allen Poe's <u>The Black Cat</u>. Needless to say, he isn't a hit and loses his audience about halfway through his reading. Thinking he can do better next time, he brings a short story by a Russian next...everyone leaves before halfway this time. Maria tells him if he is to come back and "help," he has to stop the reading sessions.

The story then winds back to 1942-1960 — Bob's childhood and teen years ending with college and his first and only job: "The northwest branch of the public library was where Bob Comet became

himself." And also makes two friends: Connie and Ethan...

Ethan, the handsome, devil-may-care man who plants himself in Bob's life. He is the antithesis of Bob, and they get along famously. Opposites attract, right?

Meeting Connie is a lucky day. Her father, a strange one for sure, gets himself kicked out of the library and needs Connie to get his books. This, of

> course, means she has to ask Bob for help in finding the obscure titles her father likes to read.

Despite his shyness around Connie, he finally works up to a proposal and she accepts. Connie's father hates Bob and immediately takes her out of his will. Oh well.

There is jealousy on Bob's part, however, whenever Bob sees Connie and Ethan together, laughing and having a good time. Eventually, that fear turns very real. How do you think Bob will handle it?

The third section of the book takes us to 1945. Bob is 11 1/2 and runs away from home. He sneaks onto a bus, then a train, where he meets two middle-aged ladies, Ida and June, an amusing pair,

to say the least. Former vaudevillians still trying to make it on the stage, they decide to let Bob join them at a small-town, crumbling hotel, where they hope to make their big comeback. This section of the book provides some kooky, funny moments in Bob's life. But then, rioting breaks out between two lumberjack camps, which is upended by the announcement of the end of World War II. What about Ida and June's big comeback?

The last section of the book is set in late 2006 when Bob receives some startling news. What he does with that information shows the extent of his deep-held feelings.

The story has a charming ending that demonstrates each one of us has a story to tell. There will be love, there will be sorrow, life may kick us in the teeth, then pat us on the head, but all the twists and turns make it just that — our own personal history, unlike anyone else's. Remember, life is an adjective as well as a noun.

The final word: This is not a book for everyone — it's more of a love-it-or-leave-it kind of read. If you love a good character study, you'll love it. If you're looking for action, you will leave it.
